- 1. Failed to avoid stopped or parked vehicle ahead
- 2. Failed to yield right-of-way
- Inattention
- 4. Driving too fast for conditions (not exceeding posted speed)
- 5. Following too closely
- 6. Disregarded traffic signal
- 7. Failed to maintain lane
- 8. Failure to decrease speed for slower moving vehicle
- Ran off Road
- 10. Improper change of traffic lanes

Top Pedestrian Errors:

- Crossing between intersections

Top Bicyclist / Pedalcyclist Errors:
