EX-POW REGISTRATION APPLICATION

For Ex-POW plates, a prisoner of war is defined as being a person who, while serving in the active military, naval or air service of the U.S. or any of its Allies, was forcibly detained or interned in the line of duty by:

- An enemy government, its agents or a hostile force during a period of war; or
- A foreign government, its agents or hostile forces under circumstances similar to periods of war.

To apply for Ex-POW plates, submit:

- This completed form.
- Proof of POW status. Proof can be **an original or copy of**:
 - A letter from the U.S. Department of Veterans' Affairs, Department of Defense, or your U.S. Armed Forces branch of service verifying your POW status; **or**
 - If an Ally, proof that you were a POW and that the country was a U.S. Ally at the time of the internment.
- A Certificate of Compliance from the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) if the vehicle is being registered within the DEQ emission testing boundaries and is not exempt.
- An Application for Registration (Form 735-268) if only applying for registration, or Application for Title and Registration (Form 735-226) and all title requirements, if applying for title with registration.

I certify that:

- I qualify as a prisoner of war, as defined above; and
- This vehicle is not a commercial vehicle with a loaded weight over 10,000 pounds; and
- No other vehicle owned by me or a member of my household has been registered with Ex-POW plates.
- I am a registered owner or lessee of the vehicle listed on this form.

I understand it is a crime under ORS 803.385 to certify the truth of a statement when I know it is not true. Such a crime is a Class A misdemeanor and is punishable by a jail sentence of up to 1 year, a fine of up to \$6,250 or both.
