

NOTICE OF RELEASE FROM INCARCERATION

(For purposes of establishing driving privilege suspension or revocation reinstatement eligibility date)

Important Information About Reinstatement After Incarceration

Under Oregon law, certain convictions listed in ORS 809.409 and ORS 809.411 can lead to the suspension or revocation of your driving privileges. If your conviction resulted in a prison sentence, you may not be eligible to apply for reinstatement until a specified period has passed after your release from incarceration.

These offenses include—but are not limited to:

- Any degree of assault
- Failure to perform the duties of a driver (hit and run)
- Aggravated vehicular homicide
- Manslaughter or criminally negligent homicide involving a vehicle

The Oregon DMV receives your incarceration release date directly from the Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC). You do not need to send release documentation, and you do not need to ask DOC to send it on your behalf. DMV will only use the release date that it receives directly from DOC in response to an official request.
