### Modern Transportation System

*The OTC and ODOT build and maintain a modern, safe, efficient, and integrated multi-modal transportation system that provides mobility and accessibility for all Oregonians and helps achieve our carbon reduction goals.*

## Goals

- 1. Preservation and Stewardship:** Preserve and maintain Oregon's transportation system and help promote a clean environment.
- 2. Safety:** Eliminate traffic fatalities and serious injuries and ensure the safety of system users and transportation workers.
- 3. Access, Mobility, and Carbon Reduction.** Provide greater access to and support a broad range of mobility options for Oregon's transportation system and help reduce carbon emissions.
- 4. Congestion Relief:** Invest in a comprehensive congestion management strategy for the Portland metropolitan region for the benefit of all Oregonians.

5. **Project Delivery:** Develop practical solutions to transportation problems that address community needs, ensure system reliability, and support a strong economy.
6. **Innovative Technologies:** Invest in and integrate technologies to improve transportation services.

### **Sufficient and Reliable Funding**

*The OTC and ODOT seek to secure sufficient and reliable funding to support a modern transportation system and a fiscally sound ODOT.*

### **Goals**

1. **Road Usage Charging:** Develop and implement statewide road usage charging to help ensure sufficient and reliable revenue for Oregon's transportation system.
2. **Tolling:** Establish a tolling system in the Portland metropolitan region to fund critical transportation infrastructure to reduce congestion for the benefit of all Oregonians.
3. **Multimodal Funding.** Pursue sufficient and reliable funding for all modes of Oregon's modern transportation system.
4. **Department's Fiscal Health:** Ensure the long-term fiscal health of ODOT by aligning ODOT expenditures with available revenue.
5. **Intergovernmental Funding:** Establish and enhance strong partnerships with system users and government partners to ensure sufficient investment in Oregon's transportation system.

## Equity

*The OTC and ODOT seek to build a more diverse, equitable, and inclusive culture and ensure that all Oregonians benefit from the services ODOT provides and investments it makes.*

## Goals

- 1. Culture, Workforce, Operations, and Policies:** Build a diverse, equitable, and inclusive culture and workforce. Apply equity principles in OTC and ODOT operations and policies.
- 2. Economic Opportunity:** Promote economic opportunity to businesses through the investments we make in communities, including businesses owned by women, racial minorities, and other historically marginalized populations.
- 3. Engagement:** Recognize the viewpoints of those who reside in the communities ODOT serves and are affected by the decisions the OTC and ODOT make.
