Public Transportation Advisory Committee FY 2021-23 Funding Award Recommendation to Oregon Transportation Commission April 5, 2021

I. Executive Summary

This report communicates the Public Transportation Advisory Committee's (PTACs) FY 2021-23 Statewide Transportation Improvement Fund (STIF) Discretionary, STIF Intercommunity Discretionary, and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5311(f) funding award recommendation to the Oregon Transportation Commission (OTC).

The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) Public Transportation Division (PTD) received <u>70 applications</u>, with grant requests surpassing available funding by nearly \$7 million. Two applications were withdrawn during the selection process. The ODOT Selection Committee submitted a <u>report</u> to PTAC, which included a prioritized list of projects for funding. The Selection Committee solicited and considered input from Qualified Entities and the Area Commissions on Transportation, which can be found in Appendices B and C of the report. After reviewing the report, PTAC recommends that OTC award grants totaling \$22,613,596, which includes unobligated FTA Section 5311 funds in addition to available STIF Discretionary and Statewide Transit Network funding. The chart below summarizes the projected fund availability by fund source for the 2021-23 biennium and PTAC's recommended award amounts by fund source.

Recommended Award Summary

II. PTAC Prioritized Funding Recommendations

PTAC recommended approval of the Selection Committee's funding recommendation, in full. PTAC also endorsed the use of unobligated FTA Section 5311 funds to fund additional projects that cannot be fully funded with available STIF funds. This would allow ODOT to fund approximately \$1.86 million in additional awards as shown in the above award summary.

The below tables present PTAC's recommended prioritization of project funding for the STIF Discretionary, STIF Intercommunity Discretionary, and FTA Section 5311(f) funds, respectively. These tables lists *all* recommended projects, including those that would require use of unobligated federal funds. Not all projects are eligible for federal funding, which will require reassignment of some projects to other fund programs. ODOT staff will coordinate with recipients, as needed, prior to moving project funding sources. ODOT will ensure that no project funded with unobligated federal

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funds will face higher match requirements or heavier compliance burdens than would be imposed under STIF. Pending the OTC's funding decision, ODOT will allocate available funding so that all PTAC-recommended projects may be funded.
