

Fast Facts about the 30-Day Fire Emergency Permit

A new permit is available for motor carriers responding to the 2020 Oregon Fire Emergency.

What dimensions are allowed on the permit?

- Up to 12 feet wide on state highways, up to 14 feet wide on Interstate highways.
- Up to 14 feet 6 inches high.
- Up to 200,000 pounds gross weight, Weight Table 4 axle and group axle weights.
- Up to 62 feet semitrailer in a heavy haul combination.
- Up to 53 feet semitrailer in truck tractor and semitrailer combinations. Longer trailers are allowed if required to support the load or distribute the weight, and the trailer can be reduced to legal length when unladen.



What is the duration of the permit?

- The permit is valid for up to 30 days. After the permit expires, CCD will send a form to report Road Use Assessment Fees (RUAF) for movement of a single, non-divisible item in excess of 98,000 pounds.
- Multiple moves are allowed on the permit.

What roads are allowed?

- All state highways. Carrier is responsible to check TripCheck prior to movement, for any width restrictions, weight restrictions, and road closures. Carrier is provided a list of all structures with a vertical clearance less than 14 feet 6 inches.
- All other roads (county, city, etc.) are NOT authorized on this permit.

What information is required to obtain the permit?

- Basic truck information (plate, jurisdiction, year, make, VIN).
- Carrier Contact information.
- Executive Order (if applicable).
