

Sidewalk Curb Ramps – City of Sandy



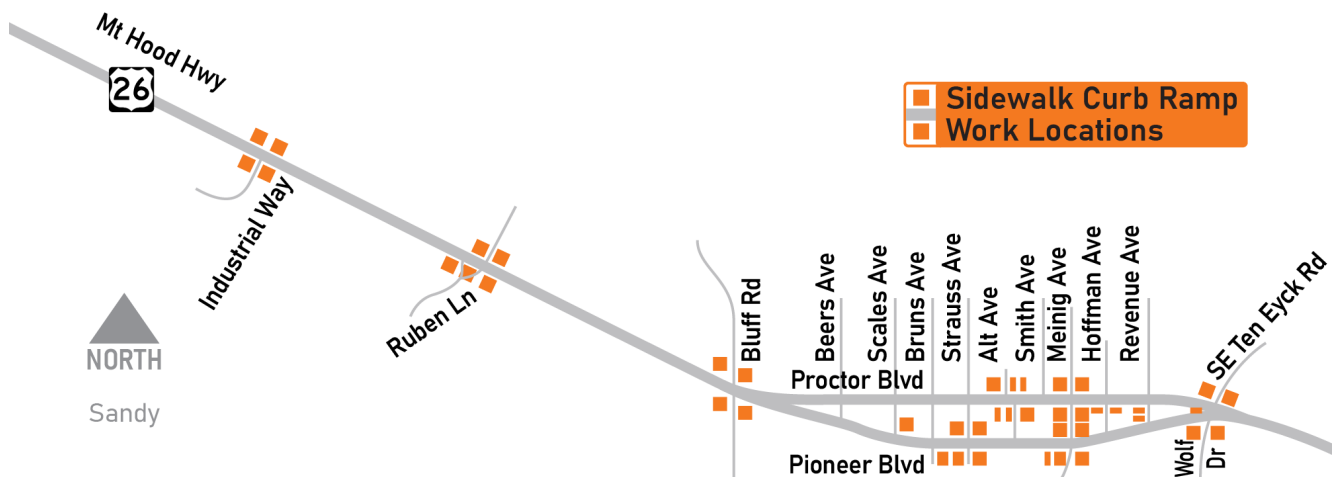
Project Details

We are bringing sidewalk curb ramps into compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility standards on U.S. 26 in Sandy. People with disabilities and everyone who uses sidewalks along the highway will benefit from these upgrades. We are replacing existing, non-compliant sidewalk curb ramps at signalized and non-signalized intersections along U.S. 26 between Industrial Way and Wolf Drive.

We are returning to Sandy to complete Phase 3 of our curb ramp project. Phase 1 was finished in August 2021, and Phase 2 wrapped up in December 2022. We are currently designing the remaining curb ramps along U.S. 26 in Sandy. Construction is scheduled for 2026. It usually takes 1-2 weeks to complete work on an individual corner, with construction on several corners happening concurrently. However, only one corner per intersection will be under construction at a time in order to better maintain access to nearby businesses and services.

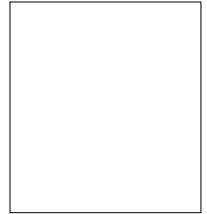

Traffic Impacts

When work begins in 2026, expect intermittent lane, shoulder and sidewalk closures on U.S. 26 and on intersecting local streets. All roads will remain open. We will provide ADA-accessible pedestrian detours around the work zones and maintain access for customers of adjacent businesses. On-street parking in some areas will be temporarily removed. We will provide more information in advance of construction.
