Improving safety and accessibility for drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists.

The All Roads Transportation Safety (ARTS) Program identifies intersections with high crash rates and then implements proven low-cost measures that help reduce crashes at these locations. An upcoming ARTS project in Washington County includes over **50 intersections along OR 8, OR 10, OR 47 and OR 219.** Work begins this spring.

Safety improvements are tailored to meet the needs of people driving, bicycling, walking and rolling at each intersection. Visit the project website at **tinyurl.com/WACountyARTS** to review the complete list of intersections and their specific improvements. Examples of planned improvements include:

- New sidewalk, accessible curb ramps, pedestrian-activated Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) and street lighting at SW Farmington Road and SW 195th Avenue to help increase driver awareness of pedestrians.
- **Buffered bicycle lanes and green conflict striping** to enhance visibility of people bicycling on OR 8 and OR 10.
- **Supplemental lighting and flashing beacons** to warn drivers of an upcoming intersection on OR 8, OR 10, OR 47 and OR 219.
- Reflectorized backboards on traffic signals and supplemental left turn signal heads to increase signal visibility and functionality on OR 8 and OR 10.
- New road markings such as **stop lines and stop ahead warnings** near intersections on OR 8, OR 10, OR 47 and OR 219.
- New signs to alert drivers of upcoming intersections, including oversized signs at unsignalized intersections on OR 8, OR 10, OR 47 and OR 219.

Construction starts this spring, continues through the end of 2024.

Construction schedule is subject to change. Work will occur at multiple intersections at once, with most traffic impacts limited to one to seven days at each location. There are a small number of intersections that will see traffic impacts for a longer duration. People should expect:

- Short-term single lane and shoulder closures in construction areas.
- Traffic lights temporarily disabled at some intersections with flaggers directing traffic.
- Temporary sidewalk closures with ADA-compliant pedestrian detours.
- Short-term bus stop relocations; check trimet.org for details.
- Temporary on-street parking restrictions.
- Daytime and nighttime work.
