

New Enhanced Pedestrian Crossings on SW Hall Boulevard

Construction Starts this Summer

The Oregon Department of Transportation, in partnership with the City of Tigard, is starting construction this summer on a project to enhance safety on Hall Boulevard (OR 141) at SW Fanno Creek Trail and SW Omara Street.

SW Hall Boulevard is a busy, 35 mile-per-hour corridor and people walk over a quarter mile to the nearest signalized intersection. This project will install a new enhanced pedestrian crossing, also known as a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon, across SW Hall Boulevard at SW Omara Street and will upgrade the existing signalized crosswalk on SW Hall Boulevard at SW Fanno Creek Trail with audible pedestrian signals, improving pedestrian safety, visibility and accessibility. Additional improvements at both of the new crossings includes upgraded sidewalk curb ramps to meet ADA requirements, new lighting, signs and striping. When the project is complete, the existing unsignalized crosswalk on the south side of Hall and SW Omara Street will be closed to improve safety.

About Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons

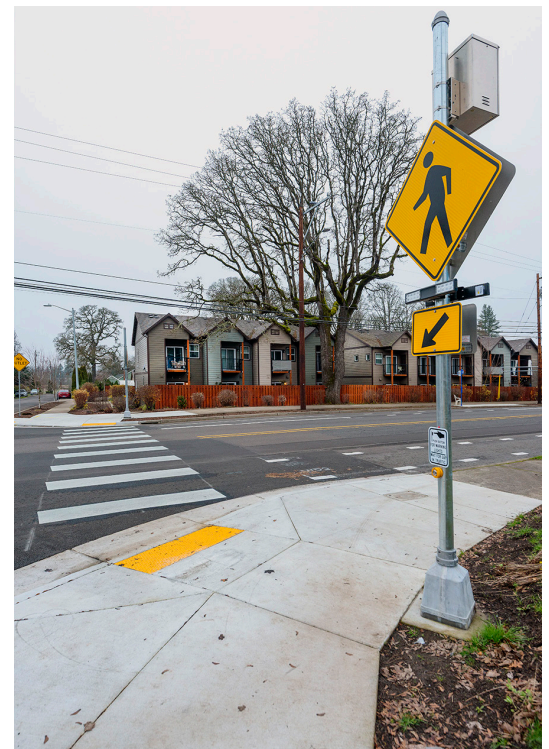
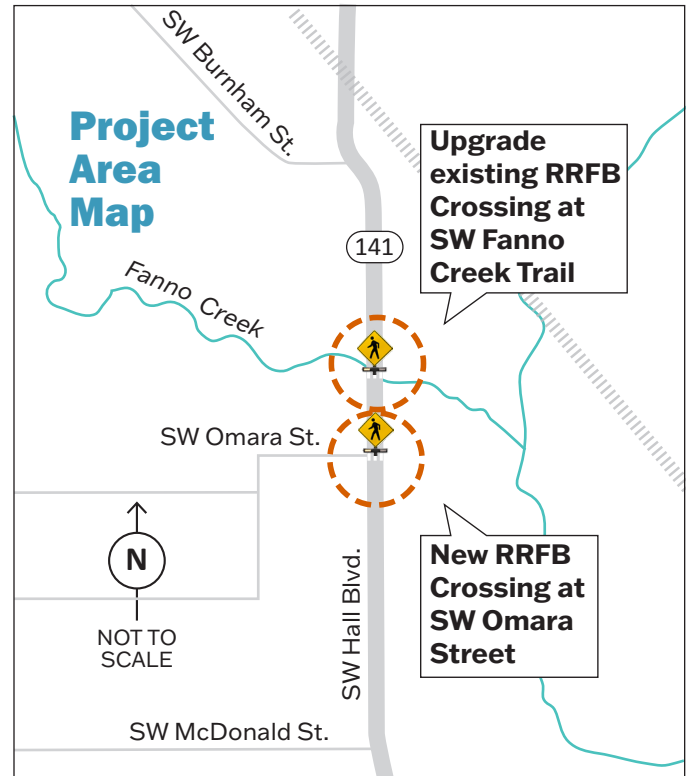
Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons, or RRFBs, use flashing yellow lights to alert drivers that someone is crossing the street. Pedestrians activate the flashing beacons with the press of a button. We install RRFBs at crossings with high pedestrian and vehicle traffic because they can reduce crashes by as much as 47 percent, according to the Federal Highway Administration. RRFBs are a critical part of our efforts to maintain a modern and safe transportation system.

Improved Safety on SW Hall Boulevard

The new and upgraded RRFBs at these two busy intersections will make it safer for people to cross SW Hall Boulevard and connect to their neighborhoods, nearby destinations like bus stops, trails, libraries, churches, local businesses, parks and other public buildings.

New sidewalk and ADA curb ramps around the intersections will make the crossings safer and more accessible for everyone. Adding a new RRFB and closing the existing unsignalized crosswalk on the south side of Hall Boulevard at SW Omara Street increases safety by protecting people who walk, bike or roll from vehicles turning onto Hall Boulevard.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

What to Expect During Construction

- Expect temporary traffic delays in the area during construction.
- Daytime and nighttime single lane closures and temporary side street closures.
- Occasional multiple lane closures under flagger control at night.
- Work requires temporary sidewalk and crosswalk closures, with signed, temporary pedestrian accessible detours around the work zone.
- Bicyclists will share the road with vehicles and use city streets during construction.

NIGHTTIME NOISE IMPACTS

Night Work

To minimize traffic impacts during the day, some night work may be required. During construction, people who live or work near the project area may hear periodic construction noise from heavy equipment, construction trucks, beeping noise when vehicles are in reverse (required by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration), and equipment such as concrete saws, drills and jackhammers, air compressors and generators.
