



# Graham Road Bridge Replacement

Due to deterioration of the bridge surfaces, the Oregon Department of Transportation is starting design work for a project to replace the bridges on Interstate 84 over Graham Road in Troutdale. Graham Road will be widened under the bridges and the height of the bridges will be raised to better accommodate truck traffic. A sidewalk and bike path will be built on the east side of Graham Road for pedestrians and cyclists.

Construction is expected to start in late 2018 and take up to 2 years to complete.\*

## Why is it needed?

Interstate 84 at the Graham Road/257th Interchange, located in the City of Troutdale, is an important freeway connection to many industrial businesses at the eastern end of the Columbia industrial corridor. The average daily traffic volumes on I-84 over Graham Road are 25,300 as measured in 2015. On Graham Road the average daily traffic volume is 15,000 measured in 2017. The project will support connections to this important employment area. The project will improve safety and capacity for all travelers in the area of this interchange.

### Traffic impacts

It is expected that there will be closures of Graham Road and lane closures or shifts on I-84. Traffic impacts and detours for motorists will be announced well in advance. Safe passage will be provided for pedestrians and cyclists during construction.

### Expected project schedule\*

October 2016 -- Project Start  
 2016-2017 -- Public Outreach  
 July 2018 -- Final Project Design  
 Spring 2019 -- Construction starts  
 Fall 2020 -- Construction complete
