

The OR 141 (SW Hall Boulevard) ADA **Ramp Improvement Project is Complete!**

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Oregon Department of Transportation invested more than \$5 million to create safer and more accessible highway connections for all sidewalk users along 1.25 miles of SW Hall Boulevard from SW Scholls Ferry Road to SW Locust Street.

The improvements comply with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards and improve safety and accessibility for all sidewalk users, including people using mobility devices and people with visual impairments. These upgrades create safer highway connections to housing, employment and businesses in the area.








Existing signalized intersections updated with new audible pedestrian push buttons for visually impaired users to cross the street safely.
