

SE McLoughlin at Boardman and Hull

Two new enhanced crossings for people walking, rolling and biking across SE McLoughlin Blvd



The Oregon Department of Transportation is working now on two new enhanced crossings on OR 99E (SE McLoughlin Boulevard) at SE Boardman and Hull Avenues.

About Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons

Rectangular rapid flashing beacons, or RRFBs, use flashing yellow lights to alert drivers that someone is crossing the street. Pedestrians activate the beacons with the press of a button. ODOT installs RRFBs at specific crossings with high pedestrian and vehicle traffic because they can reduce crashes by as much as 47 percent according to the Federal Highway Administration.

Improved safety on McLoughlin Blvd

The new RRFBs at these two busy intersections will make it safer for people to cross SE McLoughlin Boulevard to get to nearby destinations like schools, bus stops, parks, restaurants and stores.

New sidewalk curb ramps at the intersections will help make the crossings safer and more accessible. At both intersections, there will be a median island where people can activate the flashing lights with a push button again and wait for drivers to stop once they get to the center of the road.

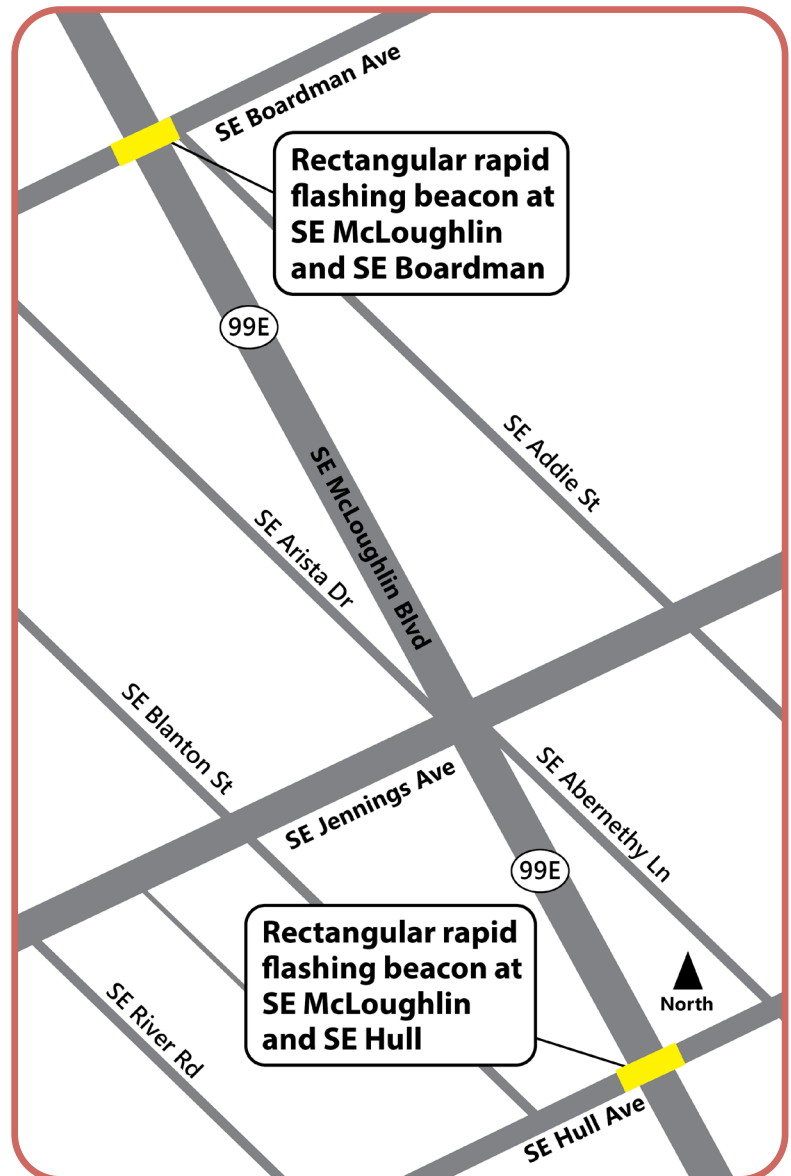
Project schedule and impacts

Construction is beginning soon and we expect it to be complete this summer. The project schedule may change, so stay up to date by visiting the project website or checking [TripCheck.com](https://www.tripcheck.com).

There may be nighttime or daytime work with this project, with **single lane closures on SE McLoughlin Boulevard in both directions**. There will be some 24/7 sidewalk closures for concrete work with an accessible detour at all times. The bike lane will be closed at times with a detour.

Residents in the area can also expect some noise during nighttime work. **For nighttime noise concerns, call 503-276-7812.**

ODOT is constructing two new enhanced crossings on OR 99E (SE McLoughlin Blvd) at SE Boardman Ave and SE Hull Ave in the Jennings Lodge area of Clackamas County. The flashing beacons will alert drivers that people are crossing the street.

Work is starting soon and we expect it to be complete in summer 2022.
