

Sidewalk Curb Ramps – U.S. 30 Bypass (Lombard Street)



Project Details

We are bringing sidewalk curb ramps to the current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility standards on highways throughout Oregon. One of these highways is U.S. 30 Bypass (Lombard Street) in Portland where a number of projects over the next several years will take place. In 2023, one of these projects includes over 30 individual, unsignalized corners on Lombard Street between North Omaha Avenue and North Greenwich Avenue. Improvements range from upgrading existing ramps to the addition of a second ramp at a corner, creating more accessible highway connections for all sidewalk users along Lombard Street.

Construction begins in September 2023 and finishes by the end of 2023. Generally, it takes 1-2 weeks to complete work on an individual corner, with construction on several corners happening concurrently. Only one corner per intersection will be under construction at a time.

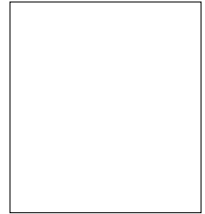

Traffic Impacts

During construction, plan for temporary lane, shoulder, parking and sidewalk closures on Lombard Street and on intersecting local streets in the project area. All roads will remain open. We will provide ADA-accessible pedestrian detours around the work zones and maintain access for customers of adjacent businesses. We will coordinate with affected property and business owners as needed.

Work Zone

Work is planned to take place during daytime work hours. Nighttime work is not expected.

The **ODOT ADA PROGRAM** is working to bring more than 25,000 curb ramps throughout Oregon into compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. The effort was launched in response to a formal complaint from the Association of Oregon Centers for Independent Living (AOCIL). Together we reached an agreement to improve curb ramps and pedestrian signals along all state highways. We are committed to new standards for accessible routes through work zones, outreach, and addressing public concerns. Everyone who uses sidewalks along our highways will benefit from this commitment and the improvements we make to the curb ramps.
