

CONSTRUCTION STARTS AUGUST 2020

PROJECT OVERVIEW

This summer, ODOT will repair the bridge over the Tualatin River on Oregon 99W northbound, between Tigard and Tualatin. This work includes replacing the bridge joints and installing new concrete surfaces. These repairs will improve the condition and maintain the long-term safety and use of this heavily traveled highway.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Periodic day and nighttime lane closures on OR 99W northbound.
- 30-day single lane closure on OR 99W northbound across the Tualatin River Bridge, leaving one lane open at a time. **Travelers should expect significant traffic congestion and delays.**
- Bicyclists will travel in the lane of traffic through the work zone.
- Detour signs will direct freight trucks to Tualatin-Sherwood Road and Roy Rogers Road to Scholls Ferry Road.

CONSTRUCTION NOISE

Daytime and nighttime construction noise will take place periodically, and those working or living in the area may hear the noise. A 24/7 nighttime noise hotline will be provided prior to construction for any noise-related concerns.

WHY IS THIS WORK NEEDED?

The bridge is constructed in segments, connected by concrete to concrete joints with joint seals. Over time, the road surface has worn down and begun to crack. It is now in need of repairs. Crews will replace the joints and the road surface, extending the life of the bridge for 20 to 30 years.
