Major Changes Summary

ODOT State Management Plan (SMP) 2015 – 2025

Overall Comments:

- The 2025 SMP has been reorganized into a new layout where each funding program's
 requirements are described under each SMP required topical area rather than broken down by
 individual program area chapters. For example, the eligible subrecipients that can apply for FTA
 funding through ODOT are all described under Section 2.4 Eligible Subrecipients, broken down
 by program, rather than individually separated by different program sections in the previous
 SMP.
- PTD's name has been updated throughout the 2025 SMP from the previous name of Rail and Public Transit Division to the current Public Transportation Division (PTD).
- The Special Transportation Fund (STF) Program has been removed from the 2025 SMP as the program was rescinded by the Oregon State Legislature and rolled into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Fund (STIF) Program.
- The Section 5303 and 5309 programs has been removed as they are not a required elements to be included in the SMP and PTD's involvement in Section 5303 and 5309 funding is minimal.
- A new section was added that aggregated all subrecipient reporting requirements into one location, Section 4.8 Reporting Requirements.

The following chart is meant to act as a crosswalk to indicate where the 2015 SMP elements have been reflected in the current 2025 SMP with an explanation of any major changes. The areas that have been eliminated are indicated in the chart below as well.
