

Umatilla County
STIF Low-Income Households

Umatilla County defines a high-percentage of low-income households in the bylaws as follows:

“any geographic area within Umatilla County that exceeds the percentage of low-income households for the state of Oregon as a whole.”

It was also determined to use information garnered from ODOT’s publication dated October 12, 2018, which will refer and explain how to use data from US Census website. REMIX software may also be used to determine large areas of low-income households.

A formula may be used as follows:

Low-income Households = Total Households x Low-income population/Total population

For the US Census Bureau population estimates for Umatilla County Oregon, Low-Income populations and Total Households, based upon July 1, 2019 estimates for the last 12 months, are as follows:

Low-income 5,670 = Total Households 30,909 x Low-Income Populations 14,299
Divided by Total Population of 77,950

Low-income households in Umatilla County is 5,670
