NW Treatment is looking to expand their DUII Program which serves clients in Multnomah and Washington County, these funds would fund the necessary hours needed to oversee the activities funded by this grant which are: overseeing the Northwest Treatment DUII program, keeping the DUII Curriculum up to date, managing relations with DUI lawyers, Alcohol and Drug Evaluation Services (ADES), judges, build relationships with all Drug Courts in Oregon, attend local DUI community meetings, and supervise all DUI client cases. The grant funds would also support the hours needed to conduct Spanish-speaking Peer Support activities of the project. Peer support activities include driving DUII clients to their required court meetings, assist in transportation for urinalysis testing, and support DUII clients in their sobriety and recovery. Finally, \$2,127 of the grant funds would be used to purchase DUII curriculum from The Change Companies called Responsible Decisions. The purchase would include the DVD, Facilitator Guide, Five Sample Journals, and training for one staff member on the curriculum.

The three major activities that this grant will support, hours needed for the DUII Coordinator activities, and for the Spanish Speaking Peer Support Specialist; and purchase of the Evidence-based DUII curriculum are all geared towards increasing participation rates, successful completion rates, and retained knowledge, all intended to make an improvement to Oregon's rate of recidivism.
