<u>Project Total</u> \$400,000 (+\$160,000) 405(d)

The original grant application and budget completed in August 2022 forecast average expenditures of \$60,000 per grant quarter. This was an educated estimate based on the trajectory of spending in previous grant quarters, but more recent reimbursement claims reflect blood sample submissions for drug testing had not peaked.

Grant funding to support statewide DUII toxicology requests has proven to be instrumental in law enforcement and prosecutors' ability to hold DUII offenders accountable. This has been especially true in cases where a suspect does not cooperate with law enforcement investigations, which often requires toxicology testing following the execution of a search warrant to seize a sample of the offender's blood. The increase in drug and polysubstance impaired driving in recent years has also seen more prosecutors come to expect blood toxicology as the best evidence for proving a driver was actively under the influence of drugs, as opposed to use of urine as prescribed by Oregon's Implied Consent law.

Mr. Stone,

The Oregon State Police (OSP) requests a grant adjustment to increase the FFY22-23 DRE Toxicology budget from \$240,000 to \$400,000.

The original grant application and budget completed in August 2022 forecasted average expenditures of \$60,000 per grant quarter. This was an educated estimate based on the trajectory of spending in previous grant quarters, but more recent reimbursement claims reflect blood sample submissions for drug testing had not peaked.

Unfortunately, it is my assessment that several factors have contributed to a rise in blood sample submissions to NMS Labs, beyond original projections.

- The impact of the May 2021 Oregon Court of Appeals decision in *State v.* Shevyakov 311 Or App 82, and subsequent procedural recommendations to law enforcement from the Oregon Department of Justice, has frequently bypassed standardized field sobriety testing at roadside and breath testing via the Implied Consent process. This limits the evidence law enforcement considers when assessing the potential impairing substance(s) a given driver is under the influence of.
- As a result, law enforcement frequently author search warrants to collect blood and/or urine samples from drivers. Anecdotally, it appears Oregon law enforcement are more comfortable utilizing the search warrant process in their jurisdictions, so breath test refusals, urine test refusals, and DRE evaluation refusals are more often overcome with search warrant applications.
- Since the OSP Forensic Services Division still lacks the capacity to test blood samples for drugs in DUII cases, only blood alcohol, many of these blood samples are submitted to NMS Labs for broad testing.
- Data from the OSP Forensic Services Division suggests drugs are more frequently detected in urine and post-mortem blood samples, and the prevalence of poly-substance and poly-category samples has risen. Data from the Oregon Department of Transportation reflects recent increases in crashes involving drug-impaired drivers.



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• Lastly, the increase of blood sample submissions and testing at NMS Labs – and previously at the Washington State Patrol lab – means increasing legal services provided by these outside labs. More frequent litigation packages, case consultations, grand jury or preliminary hearing testimony, and trial testimony is a logical consequence. We want to ensure our budget can support legal services.

We believe a grant adjustment from \$240,000 to \$400,000 will meet projected demand and allow for higher-than-expected submissions this summer, without the need to approach you again for another grant adjustment during the current federal fiscal year.
