This amendment will shift \$25,000 currently obligated to the purchase of new breath alcohol testing instruments to the DUII Statewide Media & Communications project. This will cover expenses not considered when the original media budget for FY2023 was drafted. This year, TSO leveraged new relationships with Oregon State and Portland State Universities' athletics programs to provide targeted messaging at football and basketball games. We also emphasized Spanish-language messaging to target media toward communities who are overrepresented in DUII incidents, crashes, and related negative outcomes. This was all in addition perennial media strategies which included radio, television, and streaming content, in addition to billboard and water closet ads.

The source project (M5X-23-12-18) was not a fully-developed concept for FY2023, and has been postponed to FY2024 with a different funding source. As such, no existing activities will be negatively affected by this reallocation of funds.

The funds being added to the LCOG grant are from a partner agreement between Lane County (project HU-20-10-33) and LCOG (HU-23-10-22)to combine project efforts to fund a single Safe Routes to School program.
