Status - Progress of Strategies so Far	<ul> <li>Curriculum and Instructor Training Manual revisions are complete Going to bid now for printing; Roll out for late summer, early fall courses.</li> <li>Instructor Manual is complete – going to bid for initial printing.</li> <li>In June 2022, developed and filmed two new PSAs (:15 and :30) using one of our DE instructors and two of his students. These were released in October-November 2022. Ads were also translated into Spanish and released through Univision. Over 1.2M impressions.</li> <li>Since January, we've added 5 new providers, 1 public school and 4 commercial driver training schools. One of these (Bridges) is owned by a driver rehabilitation specialist which allows to reach those students that may not be well-served by a traditional driver education school.</li> </ul>
