SUBJECT: Recap for November 3rd Committee Meeting

SIGNIFICANT REPORT ITEMS

 ORS 813.602(3)(a)(A) requires offenders who participate in a DUII diversion program to install an ignition interlock device (IID) in any vehicle they operate. The committee was made aware of statutory language here which limits that requirement to "the period of the agreement when the person has driving privileges." This caveat excludes offenders from the IID requirement if they are legally unable to, or who chose not to, reinstate their driving privileges.

While driving while suspended or without valid privileges remains unlawful, they are lesseffective barriers to DUII recidivism than an IID, which physically prevents a vehicle from being started by a person under the influence of alcohol. The committee discussed exploring a legislative "fix" that would remove this loophole from the described statute.

COMMITTEE ACTION ITEMS / RECOMMENDATIONS

• The committee is collecting a "wish list" of legislative concepts for possible recommendation to the Governor's office for the 2025 Legislative Session. Members have identified several concepts that would likely reduce impaired driving fatality and injury crashes, and the committee will be working in the coming months to select the most appropriate concept(s) to propose for the long session.
