Primary Focus	Police Traffic Services – Trainings
Strategy	To conduct law enforcement trainings related to traffic safety and enforcement as well as crash investigations and advanced motor officer training. Enhance partnerships across program areas.

Progress	<p>Agencies provide shift briefing trainings routinely, but they rarely get to hear in depth training from local and national experts. By bringing these individuals in through conferences, they reach a wider audience and officers gain a broader knowledge base on key traffic safety issues they are facing. Officers are also afforded an opportunity to get DPSST credit hours to maintain certification as well as networking with other officers.</p> <p>Most motor officer training is provided on an "as-needed" basis by local jurisdictions. Some (larger) jurisdictions host collaborative training sessions, but most are providing this training in house or on the job. The training provided is inconsistent in content, theory, application and evaluation. Officers are able to engage with other motor officer instructors in a more one to one instructor/student training session. This training is providing the officers with the opportunity to learn and practice effective real world motor officer skills and strategies and help to maintain motor officer safety while responding to traffic incidents and on traffic stops and crashes from actual motor officer instructors.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Police Traffic Safety Conference – Completed 2/8/23 • Advanced Motor Officer Training – In Progress Scheduled for 9/27 & 28 • Crash Investigation Training – Curriculum Revision In Progress
