### **SIGNIFICANT REPORT ITEMS**

- The June 2025 meeting of Governor's Advisory Committee (GAC) on DUII was held at the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) in Salem, OR. A significant part of the meeting was devoted to a historical look back on how the GAC on DUII first evolved and how various committees were later established in Oregon that dealt with the impaired driving problems. The information was provided by Troy Costales, the former administrator of the Oregon Department of Transportation Traffic Safety Division. Mr. Costales discussed the original formation of the GAC on DUII, and how that later led to a statewide summit in the mid 1980's, bringing many of the various groups and organizations together to develop strategies to reduce DUII in Oregon. From that original summit, one group has remained strong and continues today, the DUII Multi-Disciplinary Task Force. The Task Force is primarily responsible for organizing a statewide conference each year that focuses on reducing impaired driving.

### **COMMITTEE ACTION ITEMS / RECOMMENDATIONS**

- One of the GAC on DUII liaisons representing the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission reported on a publication that will soon be released involving the testing of various CDB products sold in Oregon. The report's primary focus was determining if the CDB products conform to the state's CDB and THC limits. It was reported that the findings showed that many of the products appear to be in violation. The GAC on DUII requested a copy of the final report as the committee looks at the issues of reducing cannabis impaired driving.
