SUBJECT: Recap for December 6, 2024, Committee Meeting

SIGNIFICANT REPORT ITEMS

- A presentation by Matthew Green from the Oregon Health Authority regarding their LC 469. The concept is focused on modernizing Oregon's DUII service system created in 1981. Specific areas addressed by LC include expansion of the current system partners and focusing on what they describe as "blurred lines of authority and oversight" involving the state's Alcohol and Drug Screening Specialists (ADSSs) and the maintenance of DUII records. A concern voiced by several of committee members was ensuring that ADSS's were represented in the future discussions and potential establishment of a mandated workgroup should the concept be approved legislatively.
- A liaison report by the Oregon State Police (OSP) regarding the state's Ignition Interlock Device (IID) program. According to OSP, the state has an 18 percent compliance rate of usage of IID's resulting from a DUII conviction and remains at one of lowest in the country. OSP reported they are in the process of developing and utilizing a new record system which will hopefully improve the tracking of compliance orders and rates.

COMMITTEE ACTION ITEMS / RECOMMENDATIONS

- The GAC approved the support of LC 613 submitted by Representative Marsh to increase ADDS fees in Oregon. The GAC also continues their support of the LC to reduce Oregon's DUII breath alcohol per se level to .05 percent.
