



### Rules of the road

Ride on the right side of the road with traffic.

When you ride in a group, ride in single file. Bicycles are considered vehicles according to most state and city laws — this means you have a right to the road. It also means you must obey all traffic laws.

### Hazards


Hazards can be anything that blocks your view of traffic, causes you to lose control of your bike, or crashes into you while riding. Some examples are parked cars, potholes, opening car doors, dogs, and railroad tracks.

### ou can avoid hazards
