## U.S. Traffic Fatality Rate Surges

## Move Over Law

When approaching any vehicle on the side of the road showing warning or hazard lights or indicating distress, Oregon law says you must Move Over, if you can do so safely, or slow down 5 MPH below the posted speed.

Most importantly, drivers should be alert. If you can safely move over when approaching a vehicle stopped for an emergency, do so. If you can't, slow down.
