### Breakout questions

1. **Outcomes & Opportunities:** What are the equitable outcomes and opportunities that you want to see for each of these categories?

### Neighborhood health and safety

- How could investments be made in Washington?
- What have other toll projects done?
- Map of health disparities
- Include health factors in performance measures
- Exemptions for private sector health vehicles

### Transit and multimodal access to opportunity

- Identify specific, tangible projects that will be open on day 1 of tolling
- How could investments be made in Washington (CTRAN)?
- What have other toll projects done?
- Fair reciprocity (e.g. transit wallet program)
- Importation on current and planned transit improvements (pilot program on I-205)
- Interoperability of services between TriMet, CTRAN, SMART, and others
- Updating transit assumptions and planning post-COVID
- Vanpools and ridesharing – compared to Washington, Oregon is severely lacking in vanpools
- Electric and autonomous vehicles
- First and last mile connections are important
- How can money go towards transit or multimodal with constitutional restrictions?

**Affordability**

- Identify specific, tangible projects that will be open on day 1 of tolling
- How could Washington residents have access to any benefits?
- What have other toll projects done?
- Programs for people without a bank account
- Explore discounts, credits, subsidies, incentives, or exemptions
- Exemptions for private sector health vehicles
- Exemptions for transit

**Transportation needs for historically or currently excluded and underserved communities  
(Environmental Justice)**

- Identify specific, tangible projects that will be open on day 1 of tolling
- How could Washington residents have access to any benefits?
- What have other toll projects done?
- Data on workforce flows
- Clearly define who and where, identify needs and build upon assets
- Explore the opportunity to invest in creative highway, roadway, markers, murals that are part of the Tolling program that embraces a diverse community of users
- Name ODOT's partners to best serve these communities of concern and to continue to build equity for everyday people
