#### Do I need a permit?

Each personal vehicle using the Waterfall Corridor to access the adjacent federal lands will need a permit between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. from just east of the Bridal Veil off-ramp (Exit 28) to Ainsworth State Park (Exit 35). Permits are needed from May 24 to Sept. 5, 2022.

#### Where can I get a permit?

Get your permit online for a \$2 transaction fee up to two weeks in advance. A limited amount of permits are available for same-day pickup (no fee) at the Gateway to the Gorge Visitor Center at 475 E Historic Columbia River Hwy, Troutdale, OR 97060.

#### What if I only want to go to Multnomah Falls?

Transit and tour buses stop at Multnomah Falls! By car, use I-84 Exit 31 where a separate permit is required ([www.rec.gov](http://www.rec.gov)).

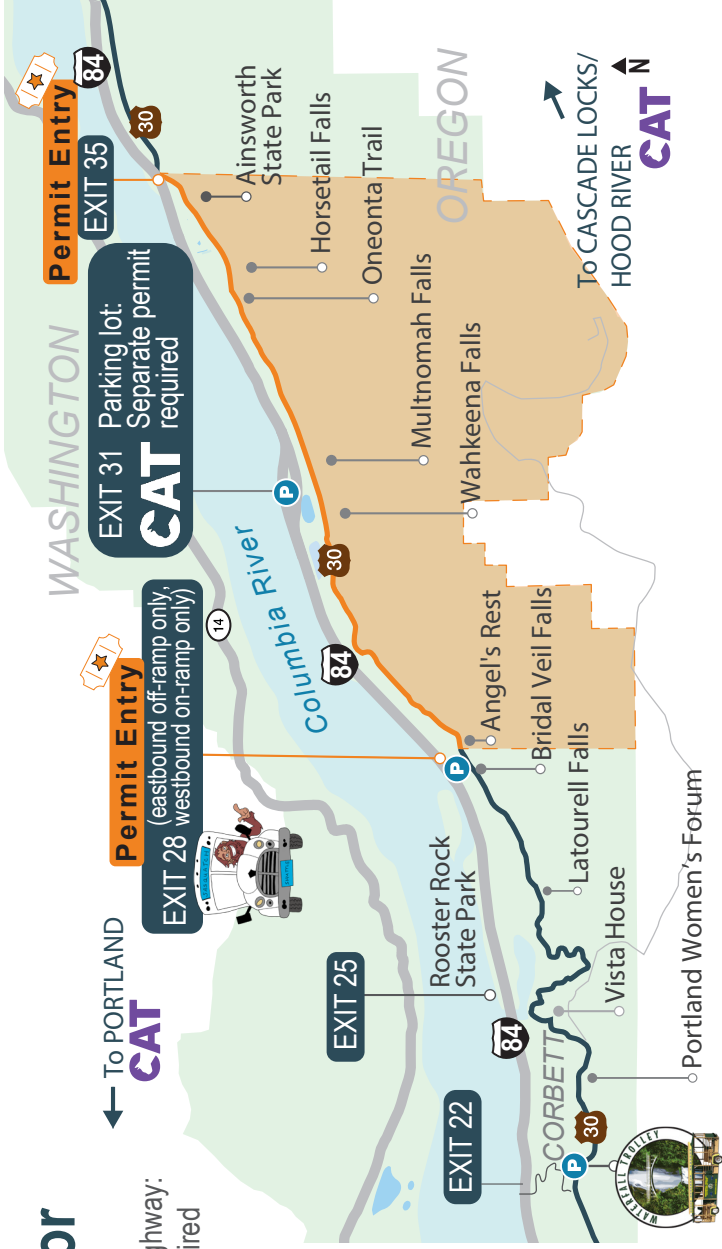
