MST Screening Report Fiscal Year 2008

VHA Directive 2005-015 mandates accurate documentation of military sexual trauma (MST) screening of Veterans, aggregated by gender. This includes tracking the compliance of each facility by monitoring the proportion of all Veterans screened for MST.

This report presents the findings of the *MST Support Team's* analyses of the rates of MST screening at each VA facility for fiscal year (FY) 2008.

Data and Methods

MST screening data were obtained from the Health Eligibility Center (HEC). Medical utilization data were obtained from the Medical Outpatient SAS Data Set, maintained by the Austin Information Technology Center (AITC).

Facility: All facilities are represented by a 3 digit station number (STA). The facilities presented in the FY2008 MST Screening Report have been organized to match the list of facilities used by the VA Office of Quality and Performance (OQP) for performance measures. This method organizes the 800+ substations of the VHA into 139 facilities.

Site Total: The site total is defined as the number of unique Veteran patients with at least one outpatient encounter at a target clinic in FY 2008 (see Monitoring MST Screening of January 12, 2009; http://vaww.collage.research.med.va.gov/collage/E_behav/MST/reports.asp). Totals are calculated for each facility separately; patients who utilize more than one facility in FY2008 are counted in the site total of each facility. This method most accurately calculates the number of patients encountered by each facility.

MST Screening Rate: The MST Screening Rate is the percentage of the site total ever screened for MST. This includes Veterans newly screened in FY 2008 and those who were screened anytime between FY 2002 – FY 2008. Patients with recorded values of “declined” were included among those screened. Patients with recorded values of “unknown” were not counted as screened.

MST + (Positive) Veterans: Patients are considered MST positive if a positive screen for MST has been recorded in the clinical reminder anytime during FY 2002 - FY 2008. This column represents the total number of MST positive Veteran patients with at least one VHA outpatient encounter at a target clinic in FY 2008.

Results

Table 1 presents MST screening rates for each facility by station number (STA). Screening rates are presented both for the site total and aggregated by gender. OMHS has set the target MST screening rate at 90% and above. This target was met by 129 facilities. These numbers are highlighted in green. Screening rates below 90% but greater than or equal to 80% are highlighted in yellow (7 facilities). Screening rates below 80% are highlighted in red (3 facilities).

- For female patients

- 133 facilities met or exceeded the 90% target
- 4 facilities screened between 80% and 90% of female patients
- 2 facilities screened fewer than 80% of female patients

- For male patients

- 129 facilities met or exceeded the 90% target
- 7 facilities screened between 80% and 90% of male patients
- 3 facilities screened fewer than 80% of male patients

Notes:

1. Facilities that appear in grey are working with the MST Support Team on known issues with implementation of the MST clinical reminder that may impact these data. These facilities are not included in the National total.
2. Rectification of data upload issues resulted in significant increases in the San Juan site total and screening numbers from those in the FY 2007 MST report.
