Effectiveness of using the IPP to help achieve training needs







- <u>Train</u>: training related to strengthening the jurisdiction/organization's, current or planned equipment and organizational capabilities.

Taking into consideration all previous preparedness activity elements discussed, along with agreed upon preparedness priorities, participants should assess submitted training priorities and opportunities which include:

- · Current training capabilities and planned courses,
- Recurring training requirements during this cycle,
- Jurisdictional/Organizational customized training
- · Training needs to close gaps (considerations from Plan, Organize, Equip, Improve), and
- Training needs to be accomplished before an exercise.

Discussion Questions

The <u>FEMA Core Capability Development Sheets</u> are a great resources for identifying possible trainings.

- Based on recently <u>completed</u> planning activities, what training needs do you have to implement those products?
- Are there any planning activities that need an amended timeline?
- Does seeing the other training activities from other jurisdictions/organizations influence/change your multi-year schedule in any way?
- Are there training offerings other <u>organizations are</u> hosting that could meet these needs, to include:
 - In your jurisdiction
 - In your region, or
 - State Government led.
- Are these training activities able to be accomplished in-house?
- Let's confirm the planning activity vision is possible and realistic.

Module 4 | Revise Multi-Year Exercise Activity Schedule

Identify potential exercises for inclusion in the multi-year schedule, including previously scheduled exercises, standing exercise requirements, and exercise activities planned at other levels such as Federal, regional, state, and local.

Based on priorities and previous preparedness activity considerations, participants should utilize the following questions to guide decisions on exercise activities for the IPP:

- · What changes to plans, policies, procedures, and checklists will need validating?
- What jurisdictions/organizations, departments, and teams need exercising and in what way?
- · Does equipment usage need validating?
- · What training is needed prior to exercising?
- · What previous corrective actions need to be validated?
- What types of exercises will meet these needs?
- What is the goal or intended outcome of the chosen exercises?

Discussion Questions

- Based on the submitted exercise data, are there events other <u>jurisdictions are</u> hosting regionally that you may want to collaborate on?
 - o Does that influence your exercise vision at all?
- Are there regional or multi-jurisdictional planning efforts that align with a completion date? Could those end in a collaborative exercise event?
- Are there future operations-based exercises that you may want National Exercise Program (NEP) support?
- Are there other exercise scopes that are not included in this vision that your jurisdiction or the region would benefit from?


