## **Basic Applied Practices Series (BAPS) Description**

The Oregon Department of Emergency Management *Basic Applied Practices Series* consists of seven required courses and four elective courses. The intent of the **BAPS** is to provide training needed by all emergency service providers for successful field operations. Courses in the *Professional Development Series (PDS)* <u>cannot</u> be used to meet BAPS elective requirements.

## The <u>seven required training</u> courses are:

- FEMA IS-100 (any version): Introduction to Incident Command System
- FEMA IS-200 (any version): ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents *OR* FEMA IS-2200 (any version): Basic Emergency Operations Center Functions
- FEMA IS-700 (any version): Introduction to the National Incident Management System (NIMS)
- FEMA IS-800 (any version): The National Response Plan (NRP), An introduction
- FEMA IS-393: Introduction to Hazard Mitigation
- FEMA IS-1000: Public Assistance Program and Eligibility
- Hazmat Awareness OR Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) Awareness (IS-5, AWR-160, AWR-358, etc.)

<u>Four elective</u> courses are also required to receive a *BAPS Certificate of Completion*. Courses may be chosen from the following list of categories:

- Any ICS Courses beyond required courses listed above (G0191, G0300, G0400, etc.)
- Any EMI/NFA attended course
- FEMA/NFA IS Courses each course must be at **least 4 contact hours (.4 CEU)** according to the EMI or NFA website. *Professional Development Series IS courses* <u>cannot</u> be used to meet this requirement.
- Community Emergency Response Team (and TTT)
- Hazardous Materials, Weapons of Mass Destruction, Domestic Preparedness Courses
- Basic or Advanced PIO (or other PIO/Crisis Communication type course)
- Earthquake Courses
- Hazard Mitigation Courses
- Radiological Courses
- Managing Emergency or Search Operations
- Mass Fatalities Incident Planning
- Defense Support of Civil Authorities (DSCA)

Upon completion of the seven required and four elective courses, interested parties should send an email to OEM State Training at <a href="mailto:oem.training@oem.oregon.gov">oem.oregon.gov</a> requesting a *Basic Applied Practices Series Certificate of Completion*. A copy of all course completion certificates must accompany the request.
