### Funding Methodology

**Applications Due:**

**Wednesday October 8, 2025, by 10pm**



For the FY25 SHSP grant cycle, the Oregon Department of Emergency Management will allocate funds to counties and tribes based on the methodology outlined in this document.

### **Formula-based Allocation**

OEM partners with Counties and tribes to identify projects within their geographical area. Counties are required to work with eligible recipient organizations within their geographic area to identify projects. Counties are not entitled to the full allocation amount, but are highly encouraged to identify non-county, local projects to increase capabilities throughout the region.

To support the efforts of all local and tribal homeland security initiatives, each jurisdiction will receive a base rate of funding. Counties also will receive an increase based on population. Tribal governments will receive a base rate of funding but not a population funding increase, as tribal member population numbers, separate from county population numbers, are not available. Population numbers are based on Portland State University's Population Research Center and the 2020 U.S. Census.

To qualify for formula-based allocations, counties and tribes must submit project applications by Wednesday October 8, 2025, by 10pm. Projects must meet requirements described in the FY25 Program Guidance, and the FY25 Investment Justification.

**FY25 UPDATE:** At the time of releasing this guidance, OEM has not yet received the 2025 NOFO. This is an attempt to provide applicants with the most accurate and timely information available. OEM expects that funds may be reduced in this grant cycle, and project level details will also be required, by OEM at the time of application to FEMA. A new requirement. In years past, states hand until the end of January to provide local project details to FEMA.

There may not be a competitive discernment of funds for 2025. designated for formula-based allocations that are not utilized by counties and tribes may be included in the total available competitive funds. This includes funds allocated to jurisdictions that do not submit project applications or funds remaining after all county or tribal projects have been funded. OEM reserves the right to work with these entities and seek MOUs for reallocation to projects of Statewide impact.

### **Federal Priority Funding minimum spend requirements:**

To apply for HSGP funds, OEM must identify at least one project for each federal priority area at the time of application to FEMA. Therefore, OEM will be allocating funds towards federal priority areas. OEM may utilize unclaimed allocation funds or non-allocated funds to meet this requirement. All remaining funds will be reserved for competitively funded projects.

### **Competitive Funds**

In addition to the formula-based allocation, counties and tribes may seek competitive funds for projects. These projects will be reviewed and scored by a grant review committee. To qualify for competitive funds, counties and tribes must submit project applications by Wednesday October 8, 2025, by 10pm. Projects must meet

requirements described in the FY24 Program Guidance, FY24 Investment Justification and the FY23 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO).
