Local Management Costs

Subapplicants can request up to five percent of their total budget in management costs per subapplication. These amounts are in addition to the total federal funds available.



Priorities for HMGP-PF-FM-5446-OR

State Priorities by Funding Categories for HMGP-PF-FM-5446-OR

All eligible entities are invited to apply however overarching priorities for funding under **HMGP-PF-FM-5446-OR** are for:

- Entities within the directly affected areas with a current FEMA-approved Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan (NHMP)
- Proposals related to wildfire mitigation
- NHMP and CWPP Creation or Updates
- Particular attention will also be given to entities who have received no or few Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) grants in the past

Priority of Funds
Those entities within the HMGP
grant declared disaster area will
take priority during the
subapplication process, however all
entities interested in HMA funding
are encouraged to submit a preapplication.

Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan Requirement (PNPs exempt)

To be an eligible HMGP subapplicant, entities must have a FEMA-approved National Hazard Mitigation Plan (NHMP) – or be annexed into one – at the time of HMGP award. However, an Extraordinary Circumstances Exception (ECE) request can be submitted at the time of award for a one-year extension.

If your entity is interested in applying for HMGP funding but does not have a current FEMA-approved NHMP, please contact the SHMO.



- (f) Private nonprofit organization means any nongovernmental agency or entity that currently has:
 - (1) An effective ruling letter from the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, granting tax exemption under sections 501(c), (d), or (e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954; or
 - (2) Satisfactory evidence from the State that the nonrevenue producing organization or entity is a nonprofit one organized or doing business under State law.




Life of an HMA Subapplication: State

Post-Disaster Subcategories

HMGP grants have 4 different subcategories that can be applied for (only one of the four per pre-application and subapplication):

- 1) Projects: There are a variety of eligible projects related to natural hazards.
- **Plans:** Natural Hazard Mitigation Plans (NHMP) and Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP) are the two most common uses for planning funds. *Emergency Operations Plans are ineligible.*

Eligible ning-Related Activ

- **3) 5% Initiative:** For mitigation activities that are difficult to evaluate using FEMA-approved cost-effectiveness methodologies (does <u>not</u> require a benefit cost analysis).
- **4) Advance Assistance:** Used to develop mitigation strategies and obtain data to prioritize, select, and develop complete HMA subapplications in a timely manner (up to 25% of the HMGP ceiling or up to \$10,000,000).



Cost-Effectiveness

- Benefit-cost-analysis (BCA) is typically the biggest challenge for subapplicants
- Determines the future risk reduction benefits of a hazard mitigation project and compares those benefits to its costs.
- Cost-effectiveness = Benefit-Cost Ratio (BCR) is 1.0 or greater.
- Pre-calculated benefits for several projects including:
 - Acquisitions and Elevations in the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA)



BCA Post-Wildfire Mitigation

- Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Post Wildfire
- Hospital Generators
- Must use FEMA-approved methodologies and tools—such as the <u>BCA</u> Toolkit—to demonstrate the cost-effectiveness

Management Costs Fact Sheet



- Cost Share: 75% federal & 25% local cost

 Contributions of cash, third-party in-kind services, materials, or any combination
- Management Costs: FEMA will provide 100% funding for subapplicant management costs
 - Up to 5% of total project cost
 - Includes indirect costs
 - Grant Management vs Project Management
 - Delivery of technical assistance
 - Managing awards
 - Technical monitoring
 - Purchase of equipment, per diem and travel expenses, and professional development
 - Staff salary costs directly related to performing the activities listed above
- Pre-award Costs: incurred after the HMA subapplication period has opened, but prior to FEMA award
