### What is Slido?

Slido (pronounced Sly-doe) is an audience interaction platform. It will help Oregon Prepared Strategic Planning Workshop organizers get the most out of the session by crowdsourcing top questions and engaging feedback using live polls.

### How do I use it?

### I accessed the link, now what?

Cast your vote in the polls, participate in the word cloud, and submit your questions for the Panel Q&A session hosted at the end of the session.

### **Word Clouds**

A word cloud is a visual representation of words or phrases. The greater the number of times a word or phrase is entered by participants, the larger the word or phrase appears in the graphic. This gives insight into the topics that matter most to you.

The Strategic Planning Workshop has made three word clouds available in Slido:

- 1. When you think about the Oregon Department of Emergency Management's **mission**, what is most important to you?
- 2. When you think about the Oregon Department of Emergency Management's **vision**, what is most important to you?
- 3. When you think about the Oregon Department of Emergency Management's **core values**, what is most important to you?

## **Multiple Choice**

The IDEA Workshop has one multiple choice question seeking audience feedback on our agency's IDEA planning:

- 1. Which of our agency's IDEA strategies do you feel is the most urgent? Please select all that apply.
  - a. Create and sustain an internal culture at ODEM that prioritizes inclusion, diversity, equity and accessibility.
  - Identify and eliminate obstacles to recruiting and retaining diverse talent, incorporating meaningful support structures and professional development opportunities to ensure equitable career advancement and a sense of belonging.

- c. Seek out and eradicate barriers to equitable community input in all phases of the disaster cycle by building upon existing partnerships and identify new pathways for community collaboration.
- d. Develop new structures for procurement and business practices that prioritize equity in vendor selection.
- e. Build in equity as a fundamental element of budget decision making processes, with special attention to the ways in which distributive, procedural, systemic, and recognitional equity can inform resource allocation decisions.

  - a. Continuously seek external funding sources for compensating members of CBOs for their time and expertise in informing agency strategies and outreach efforts.
  - b. Renew ODEM's commitment to Diversity Emergency Management Advisory Committee (DEMAC), a cross-disability council that works toward equity in emergency management.
  - c. Amend the role of agency regional coordinators to more directly inform agency wide initiatives and elevate local concerns to leadership in a more responsive manner.
  - d. Ensure that the agency's Tribal Liaison has a standing presence in leadership meetings, and dedicated time to update Director and Deputy Director on important issues related to Tribal engagement.
