WHEREAS: Several hundreds of dedicated telecommunication professionals answer nearly 2 million

emergency calls a year and serve Oregonians and Oregon visitors 24-hours a day, seven days

a week, 365 days a year; and

WHEREAS: Oregonians during the past year have endured numerous and ongoing disasters and rely on

the dedication and professionalism of these telecommunicators who answer 9-1-1 emergency

calls for law enforcement, fire, and emergency medical services, then dispatch the

appropriate assistance as quickly as possible; and

WHEREAS: These professionals are often the sole lifeline to our first responders in the field; and

WHEREAS: Skillful and experienced public safety communicators, who support emergency response and

show devoted commitment every day, serve as a vital link between Oregonians and the public safety providers who save lives, protect property and apprehend criminals; and

WHEREAS: The critical functions performed by professional telecommunicators also include those related

to operations performed by federal, state, local and Tribal government agencies to include

Emergency Management, highway safety, and search and rescue; and

WHEREAS: Public safety associations and other organizations from the US and Canada have set aside a

week in April to recognize telecommunicators and their crucial role in the protection of life

and property.

THEREFORE: I, Tina Kotek, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim April 13-19, 2025 to be
