Methodology

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General

For the Federal Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26) State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) grant cycle, the Oregon Department of Emergency Management (OEM) will allocate funds to counties, Tribes, and Regional Bomb Teams based on the methodology outlined in this document.

Formula-Based Allocation

OEM partners with counties, Tribes and Regional Bomb Teams to identify projects within their geographical area. Counties and Tribes are required to work with eligible subrecipient organizations within their jurisdiction to identify projects. Counties are not entitled to the full allocation amount, but are highly encouraged to identify non-county, local projects to increase capabilities throughout the region.

To support the efforts of all local and Tribal homeland security initiatives, each jurisdiction will receive a base rate of funding. Counties also receive an increase based on population. Tribal governments do not receive a population funding increase, as Tribal member population numbers, separate from county population numbers, are not available. Population numbers are based on Portland State University's Population Research Center's 2025 Certified Estimates.

To qualify for formula-based allocations, counties, Tribes and Regional Bomb Teams must **submit project applications by Wednesday October 21, 2026, by 10 p.m.** Projects must meet requirements described in the FY26 Program Guidance, and the FY26 Investment Justification.

FY26 Update

FEMA continues to place new and additional requirements on HSGP funding. FEMA has placed a new 20 percent funding hold until OEM can demonstrate compliance with the election security national priority area 3 percent minimum spend. There is also a minimum spend of 10 percent on the national border security priority area. At the time of award, OEM will not have access to 33 percent of the total SHSP award. OEM is partnering with the Secretary of State and the Department of Justice (DOJ) on the election security and border security requirements.

Oregon has joined several states in a lawsuit challenging the 20 percent holds, more information available from [DOJ here](#). Until that case is settled, OEM cannot open applications for competitively funded projects due to lack of access to SHSP funds. As funds become available, OEM will open the application process for competitive funds. As in years past, allocation funds not claimed by applicants may roll over into the competitive funding pool. OEM reserves the right to retain unclaimed funds, as necessary, to meet federal requirements under the grant.

Competitive Funds (once available)

In addition to the formula-based allocation, counties and Tribes may seek competitive funds for projects. These projects will be reviewed and scored by a grant review committee.
