



Oregon Health Plan (OHP) is Oregon's Medicaid program. It provides access to health coverage for individuals with lower incomes.

Medicaid covers doctor appointments, hospital care, behavioral health services, oral health services, prescriptions, health-related social needs services and additional benefits for children and pregnant people.

Medicaid lowers health care costs by providing people with access to preventative care, which reduces the need for emergency services. This saves money, while ensuring access to care for people.

#### **Key Numbers**

- Oregon has 1.4 million Medicaid members
- 1 in 3 people in Oregon are covered by Medicaid
- 57% of children in Oregon are covered by Medicaid
- Half of births in the state are covered by Medicaid
- 2 out of every 3 nursing home residents rely on Medicaid
- Counties in rural areas typically have higher Medicaid enrollment







OHP is for low-income Oregonians. For example, a single adult with an income of \$20,784 or less per year or a family of four with an annual income of \$43,056 per year (full income eligibility <u>chart</u>), would qualify.

There are many reasons why someone may need OHP. This includes people who have a qualifying income and/or a:

- Sudden change or loss of income
- Life-threatening diagnosis
- Need for home and community-based services
- Intellectual or developmental disability
- Substance use disorder



Medicaid is jointly financed by the state and federal government. The percentage of costs paid by the federal government – known as the Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) – varies across states as determined by a formula set in statute. The FMAP formula provides a minimum federal match rate of 50% (the "floor"), with higher match rates for states with lower average per capita income.

The match rate also varies depending on the eligible population. In Oregon, the federal government covers 71% of costs for the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and 58% for other Medicaid populations. Of Oregon's Medicaid dollars, approximately 99% goes to pay care providers, and only 1% goes to administration.





# Percent of population enrolled in Medicaid, by county.























### Oregon Congressional District 5






## **Oregon Congressional District 6**




