

Oregon Medicaid reimbursement for doula services

This fact sheet explains how doulas can work with Medicaid-enrolled practitioners to serve Oregon Health Plan members on a fee-for-service (“open card”) basis.

To learn about reimbursement for doula services to coordinated care organization (CCO) members, contact the member’s CCO.

Become a certified and registered Traditional Health Worker (THW).

Become an Oregon Medicaid provider.

Once you are a registered doula on the THW Registry, you need to [get a National Provider Identifier \(NPI\)](#), then enroll as an Oregon Medicaid provider using the [OHP 3113 form](#).

- Include your NPI and a copy of your OEI certification.

Partner with a Medicaid-enrolled licensed practitioner.

You will need to have an agreement with the practitioner that states you will provide services and be reimbursed by the practitioner as a practice expense.

- The practitioner must be a physician or advance practice nurse (e.g., Certified Nurse Midwife) enrolled with OHA as an Oregon Medicaid provider.

Doula services covered by Oregon Medicaid

Service	Description	Rate
Standard doula benefit	Six maternity support visits <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Four home visits before delivery■ Two home visits after delivery Doula support provided on the day of delivery	\$350

When a doula provides some, but not all, services included in the standard doula benefit:

Service	Description	Rate
Home visits	Up to six maternity support visits <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Four home visits before delivery■ Two home visits after delivery	\$41.67 per visit
Doula support	Doula services provided on day of delivery only	\$100
