RACE, ETHNICITY, LANGUAGE, AND DISABILITY DEMOGRAPHIC DATA COLLECTION STANDARDS

Purpose

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9 These rules establish uniform standards and practices for the collection of 10 data on race, ethnicity, preferred spoken or signed and preferred written 11 language, and disability status by the Oregon Health Authority (Authority) 12 and Department of Human Services (Department), and others required by law 13 or contract. Standardized data collection methodology will improve the 14 ability of the Authority, Department, community stakeholders, elected 15 officials, and other decision makers to recognize, address, target and 16 eliminate inequities experienced by distinct racial, cultural, and linguistic 17 communities, and by people with disabilities. Based on local, state, and 18 national best practices, these standards allow the Authority and Department 19 to meet federal reporting expectations; compare Oregon's progress with 20 national trends; improve quality service delivery; and ensure equitable 21 allocation of resources. 22

 The following definitions apply to OAR 943-070-through 943-070-0070:
 (1) "American Indian/Alaska Native" is a federal demographic category
 meaning an individual having their origins in any of the original peoples of
 North, Central or South America who maintains tribal affiliation or
 community attachment, including an individual that is:

(a) An individual defined as "Indian" at 25 USC 1603(13), 1603(28), or 1 1679(a), or who has been determined eligible as an Indian, under 42 CFR 2 136.12. This means the individual is a member of a federally recognized 3 Indian tribe or resides in an urban center and meets one or more of the 4 following criteria: 5 6 (i) Is a member of a tribe, band, or other organized group of Indians, including 7 those tribes, bands, or groups terminated since 1940 and those recognized now 8 or in the future by the state in which they reside, or who is a descendant, in the 9 first or second degree, of any such member; 10 11 (ii) Is an Eskimo or Aleut or other Alaska Native; 12 13 (iii) Is considered by the Secretary of the Interior to be an Indian for any 14 purpose; or 15 16 (iv) Is determined to be an Indian under regulations issued by the Secretary of 17 the Interior. 18 19 (b) Considered by the Secretary of the Interior to be an Indian for any purpose 20 or is considered by the Secretary of Health and Human Services to be an 21 Indian for purposes of eligibility for Indian health care services, including as a 22 California Indian, Eskimo, Aleut, or other Alaska Native. 23 (c) A member of the Indigenous People of Canada and Latin America with 24 origins in any of the original peoples of Canada, Mexico, Central America and 25 South America. 26 27 (2)"African" means an individual identifying with or descending from any 28 of the racial groups of Africa whose national origin is from a country on 29 the continent of Africa. 30 31 (3) "African American or Black" is a federal demographic category 32 meaning an individual identifying with or descending from any of the 33 black racial groups of Africa. 34 35 (4) "Asian" is a federal demographic category meaning an individual 36 identifying with or descending from any of the original peoples of East 37

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Asia, Southeast Asia, or South Asia including Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam. (5) "Authority" means the Oregon Health Authority. (4) "Contractor" means a person or governmental entity who has a legal agreement with the Authority or Department to provide goods or services. (5) "Declined to answer" is a demographic designation used when the individual actively chooses not to provide information on their race or ethnicity. (6) "Demographic data" means collected information related to age, gender, race, ethnicity, preferred spoken, signed and written language, and disability status. Demographic data under these rules will be collected for the purpose of better understanding populations who interact with the Authority and the Department. "Department" means the Department of Human Services. (7)(I 0) "Disability" means a condition meeting the criteria for establishing that an individual has a disability under ORS 659A.104. (11) "Ethnicity" means a demographic designation for a group of people sharing a culture that includes race, religion, language, and other cultural characteristics including ancestry or country of origin. (12) "Hispanic or Latino" is a federal demographic category meaning an individual of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, Dominican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race. (11) Middle Eastern and North African (MENA) includes people who report Middle Eastern entries such as Bahrain, Cyprus, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Oman, Palestine, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Turkey, United Arab Emirates and Yemen, as well as North African entries such as Algeria, Libya, Egypt, Morocco and Tunisia.

1 2	(12) "Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander" is a federal demographic category meaning an individual having origins in any of the original
3	peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.
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5	(13) "Other" means an individual identifies with a demographic designation not
6	listed.
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8	(14) "Primary racial or ethnic identity" means the race or ethnicity with
9	which an individual most identifies when opting to choose from multiple
10	designations.
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12	(15) "Race" means a demographic designation for a group of people who share
13	a common heredity.
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15	(a) Race includes shared ancestry, national origin and sociocultural
16	characteristics.
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18	(b) Race is not a biological, anthropological or genetic distinction.
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20	(16) "Subcontractor" means a person or governmental entity who has a legal
21	agreement with a contractor as that is defined in this rule, to provide goods
22	or services.
23	
24	(17) "Unknown" means a category used when a demographic designation is
25	missing for some reason other than the individual declining to answer and
26	includes, but is not limited to situations where:
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28	(i)The individual or caregiver is unable to provide an answer; or
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30	(ii) There is no available family member or caregiver to respond for the
31	individual.
32	
33	(18) "White" is a federal demographic category meaning an individual having
34	origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, excluding the Middle East
35	or North Africa. It includes people who indicate their race as "White" or
36	report entries such as Irish, German, Italian, Lebanese, Arab, Moroccan, or

 ADA, language access requirements, and the advancement of health equity.

(2) Data collection methods, such as anonymous surveys, surveys with youth, or
phone surveys, shall account for the need to gather data from individuals with
disabilities, non-English speakers and individuals with other access barriers and
shall not be used to exclude subgroups of people based on the need to gather
information from those subgroups differently.

Demographic Data Collection Standards

(I) To the greatest extent practicable, all programs and activities of the Authority and Department, including activities to promote workforce diversity within the Authority and Department, Agency and Department licensees, and boards and commissions staffed by the Authority and the Department, that collect, record or report any demographic data through any means shall collect race, ethnicity, preferred spoken, signed and written language, and disability status data in accordance with these rules and implementing policy.

(2) To the greatest extent practicable, the Authority and the Department shall
require contractors and subcontractors, who collect, record or report any
demographic data on behalf of the Authority and Department to collect race,
ethnicity, preferred spoken, signed and written language, and disability
status data in accordance with these rules and Authority and Department

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- 3 (3) When collecting data in accordance with these rules, the following
 4 apply:
- (a) To the greatest extent practicable, the Authority, the Department, andcontractors and subcontractors should ask Iindividuals should be asked to
 self-report race, ethnicity, preferred signed, written and spoken language
 and disability status information and information should not be assumed or
 prejudged.
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- (b)If an individual is unable to self-report and a family member, advocate, or
 authorized representative is unable to report on his or her behalf, the
- information shall be recorded by staff as unknown.
- (c)When a demographic category is listed as unknown, demographic data
 shall be requested at a subsequent encounter.
- (4) When an individual declines to identify race or ethnicity or
 preferred signed, written, or spoken language, or disability status the
 information shall be reported by staff as declined to answer.
- (5) When the race, ethnicity, signed, written or spoken language or
 disability status of an individual is required by federal law and an individual
 is unable or unwilling to self-report, this information shall be recorded in
 the data collection instrument and additionally identified as "staff
 determined," and combined with the "unknown" category for state level
 analysis.
- (6) Requests for demographic information shall be distinct from
 questions related to program eligibility criteria and an individual's decision
 not to answer questions related to demographic data shall not affect
 eligibility or inclusion in any related program or benefit-
- (7) Nothing in these rules shall be construed to prohibit the collection
 of information for purposes of establishing eligibility for a specific

program or service.

(8) The date for when the data was collected shall be captured and included
in the dataset holding the REALD data.

(9) Every time data is collected from individuals, REALD questions must be asked unless previously asked within the 12 months.

15 Race and Ethnicity Demographic Data Collection Standard

(1) To the greatest extent practicable, an individual shall be asked open ended questions designed to elicit an unprompted response related to
 ancestry, race, ethnicity, country of origin or tribal affiliation.

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(2) At minimum, the demographic data categories in this section shall be
listed with the identifying label of "Racial or ethnic identity" on data
collection and intake forms. These categories are designed to aggregate to
existing federal reporting categories as those categories are defined in these
rules.

1	(1) At a minimum, Individuals over the age of 5 shall be asked open-
2	ended questions designed to elicit an unprompted response related to-
3	preferred spoken, signed and written language.

10	(4) If the response to either question is section (1) of this rule indicate English

17	asked what type of interpretation is needed

19	(6) How well do you speak English? (age 5 and above) There are four answer
20	categories: Very well, well, not well, and not at all.

24	(8) If the person does not answer the preferred language questions in this section,
25	the response option in online systems shall indicate "did not answer"; the use of English as the default answer is not acceptable.

27 28	(9) Data collection tools using online platforms shall avoid the use of 'other'
28 29	categories unless the tool also allows the person to specify further in an open-text
30	field.

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24	(I) To the greatest extent practicable, Authority, Department and contractor-
25	or subcontractor staff gathering demographic data from an individual shall
26	ask "Are you limited in any way in any activities because of physical, mental,
27	or emotional problems?" Individuals may answer yes, no, don't know, or
28	decline to answer.
29	
30	(2) The following set of questions shall be asked to identify sub-groups of
31	individuals with disabling conditions.
32	(a) Are you deaf or do you have serious difficulty hearing?
33	
34	(b) Are you blind or do you have serious difficulty seeing, even when wearing
35	glasses?
36	
37	(c) Because of a physical, mental, or emotional condition, do you have

1	serious difficulty concentrating, remembering, understanding or
2	making decisions? (ages 5 years and older)

4	(d) Do you have serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs? (ages 5 years
5	and older)

26	themselves are exempted from having to answer questions specified in 2a
27	through 2i. Parents and guardians reporting for these youth however are not
28	exempted.

27	Publishing REALD data by the Authority and the Department
28	(1) This rule applies only to the Authority and the Department when reporting
29	summary data with demographic information that is made available to the
30	public.
31	
32	(2) At a minimum, the Authority and the Department shall use:
33	(a) Primary racial and ethnic identity when reporting race or ethnicity
34	information in such a way that it adds to 100 percent.
35	(b) A composite disability variable created such that it adds up to 100 percent.
36	
37	(3) The Authority and Department when reporting demographic data alone or

- in combination with other data elements shall do so using the detailed REALD data categories while still protecting the privacy of individuals represented in the data.
- (4) If there is a need to suppress detailed REALD demographic data before
 publication in order to protect confidentiality, the Authority and the
 Department shall follow the guidelines for suppressing or aggregating data
 categories specified in Authority and Department provided tools. Data
 should be aggregated to the lowest level possible before it becomes
 necessary to suppress data due to small cell sizes.
- 12 (5) When reporting according to the federal Office of Management and Budget
- 13 (OMB) standards is required, the Authority and the Department should roll up
- 14 REALD data categories into OMB categories.
- (a) Individuals identifying one or more of the MENA categories only, shall be
 rolled up to the "White" category in the OMB standards.
- (b) Individuals identifying as one or more of the MENA categories who did
 not indicate one or more of the Black categories shall be rolled up to the
 "White" category in the OMB standards.
- (c) Individuals identifying one or more of the MENA categories and one or
 more of the Black categories shall be rolled up to the "Black" category in
 the OMB standards MENA roll up to OMB
- the OMB standards MENA roll-up to OMB.
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
