Race/Ethnicity

- Added 23 additional race/ethnicity categories
 - Incorporated required race categories for providers in Washington State (n=70) AND detailed AOIC 2020 Census figures for Oregon to find a middle ground
 - (Continued on next slide)



Race/Ethnicity (Continued)

- Considered numbers available for Jewish communities in the Portland Metro area (due to lack of other figures) and how people prefer to self-identify in the case of Afro-Latino/a/e/x
- Includes feedback and discussions with RAC members AND external community organizing with Jewish & MENA communities



Race/Ethnicity (Continued)

- 15 >2000 & required by Washington
- 5 requested by Jewish (3) & MENA (2)
 & Latino/a/x/e community members (1)



Race/Ethnicity (Continued)

- 3 Other unlisted, please specify _____ (for Jewish, Middle Eastern and North African)
 - Paper forms add text and format for open text responses (e.g. Other Black changes to Black-Other unlisted, please specify).
 - Online formats can use display logic to elicit open text based on selection of "Other" categories, and store that information in one additional open text field



Race/Ethnicity Groups Added

- Asian (n=5): Afghan, Indonesian, Pakistani, Taiwanese, Thai
- Hispanic/Latino/a/x/e (n=3): Afro-Latino/a/x/e;
 Cuban, Puerto Rican
- Jewish (n=3): Ashkenazi, Sephardic, Jewish-Other unlisted
- MENA (n=9): Egyptian, Iranian, Iraqi, Lebanese, Palestinian, Syrian, Turkish, Middle Eastern-Other unlisted; North African – Other unlisted
- White (n=3): Romanian, Russian, Ukrainian

Disability

 Disability question asked after all other disability questions: "If you identify as someone with a disability, or as having a physical, mental, emotional, cognitive, or intellectual condition, please tell us what would you like us to know?" (with open text box)

SOGI for Minors (under age 18)

- Takeaway from 12/15 RAC meeting: Important to ensure clear and comprehensive communication about confidentiality when collecting data from minors
- Updated messaging in OARs to providers about what must be communicated prior to data collection
 - What needs to be communicated can vary by context (e.g., anonymous survey vs. information stored on health records)



Demographic Data Collection Messaging (all ages)

From ORS 413.164:

"(3.b.C.) Prior to data collection, requestors must inform the individual and, if applicable, their caregiver or guardian:

- That data collected under subsection (2) of this section is reported to the authority;
- How the authority, coordinated care organization, health care provider and health insurer use the data..." (continued on next slide)

Demographic Data Collection Messaging (all ages) Continued

- "...Of the purposes for which the data may not be used;
- That the patient, client or member is not required to answer questions regarding race, ethnicity, preferred spoken and written languages, disability status, sexual orientation and gender identity"

This is for all individuals, not just minors



Demographic data collection messaging (minors)

Proposed messaging to be added to OARs:

"In addition to the communication required in ORS 413.614 section (3), prior to collecting REALD and/or SOGI data from an individual under age 18, requestors submitting under ORS 413.164 must inform the individual of all relevant confidentiality policies and regulations, including who may access the individual's demographic information and whether or not this information may be disclosed to parents or guardians."





Opportunity for community engagement

Determine Critical Event for Tribes

Draft text + Notice

RAC meeting

Review edits

Public comment phase – Editing rules

Review comments

Public comment period ends

Public Hearing Notice in SOS Oregon Bulletin: Public comment period begins

File Notice

Finalizing phase – Filing permanent rules

File Permanent Rules Post to agency website

Notify RAC + interested parties

END

Rules complete, program moves to implementation
