OHA Legislative Priorities

- Set Medicaid funding on a sustainable path for the next six years
- Transform health care delivery and reduce costs
- Help families give their children a healthier start in life

Medicaid Funding

- **Set Medicaid funding on a sustainable path for the next six years**
 - Medicaid funding components (HB 2269, HB 2010)
 - Increase the price of tobacco and vaping (HB 2270, POP 406)

Health Care Transformation

- **Transform health care delivery and reduce costs (POP 422)**
 - Support implementation of CCO 2.0 contracts and performance monitoring (HB 2267, POP 416)
 - Improve CCO financial reporting and solvency (HB 2268)
 - Expand hepatitis C treatment (POP 415)
 - Hospital emergency department discharge data collection (SB 23)

Healthier Starts

- **Help families give their children a healthier start in life (POP 404)**
 - Provide universal home visiting after birth (POP 401)
 - Expand mental health access in schools (POP 402)
 - Invest in suicide intervention and prevention (POP 402)
 - Provide intensive in-home behavioral health services for kids (POP 403)

Behavioral Health

- **Provide access to behavioral health services in the right place at the right time (POP 409, POP 413)**
 - Improve health outcomes through supportive housing
 - Invest in a more connected behavioral system (POP 411, POP 414)
 - Expand community services for criminal defendants with mental illness (SB 24, SB 25, POP 410)
 - Establish a statewide Behavioral Health Home program (SB 22)
 - Continue to support development of behavioral health medication treatment algorithms (HB 2035)

Public Health Modernization

- **Create a modern public health system that will keep communities safe and healthy (POP 419, POP 420)**
 - Improve communicable disease protection and emergency preparedness (POP 405)
 - Protect drinking water systems (SB 27, POP 418)
 - Strengthen local health infrastructure (POP 417)

SB 24	Modifies procedures related to aid & assist defendants	In Senate Judiciary
SB 25	Promotes efficiency in forensic evaluation procedures	In Senate Judiciary
SB 26	Directs OHA to discharge employee in cases of physically or sexually abused patient or client	Passed Senate Human Services 4-0; passed Senate floor 29-0
SB 27	Authorizes OHA to adopt schedule for fees on water suppliers	Passed Senate Health Care 4-0; referred to Ways & Means
SB 28	Increases fees related to tourist facilities, public spas, pools and bathhouses, bed and breakfasts, restaurants and vending machines	Passed Senate Health Care 4-0; referred to Ways & Means
SB 29	Modifies various public health statutes (housekeeping bill)	Passed Senate Health Care 4-0; moved to Senate floor
SB 253	Authorizes Public Health Officer to appoint local health officer in certain counties (relinquishment)	Work session in Senate Health Care on 2/11
HB 2035	Reestablishes Mental Health Clinical Advisory Group	In House Health Care
HB 2036	Allows police officers and firefighters to participate in benefit plans offered by PEBB/OEBB	In House Health Care
HB 2037	Allows PEBB/OEBB to make available long term care insurance plans at its discretion rather than required	In House Health Care
HB 2038	Allows PEBB/OEBB to not publicly disclose proposals from prospective contractors	In House Rules
HB 2039	Transfers to PEBB/OEBB the duty to review eligibility relating to spouses or dependents	In House Health Care
HB 2040	Adds two members to Traditional Health Workers Commission	Work session in House Health Care on 2/12
HB 2265	Modifies various health care practitioner statutes (housekeeping bill)	Passed House Health Care 11-0; passed House floor 55-0; referred to Senate Health Care
HB 2266	Requires OHPB to study changes in health care coverage since implementation of ACA	In House Health Care
HB 2267	Relating to CCO board transparency	In House Health Care
HB 2268	Relating to financial regulation of CCOs	In House Health Care
HB 2269	Relating to health care finance	In House Health Care
HB 2270	Increases taxes on cigarettes and inhalant delivery systems	Referred from House Health Care to House Revenue
