It is adjudged that the defendant has been convicted on the following count(s):

Count 1 : Making a False Claim for Health Care Payment

Count number 1, Making a False Claim for Health Care Payment, 165.692, Felony Class C, committed on or between 08/31/2015 and 09/09/2015. Conviction is based upon a Guilty Plea on 01/30/2017.

Sentencing Guidelines

The Crime Severity Classification (CSC) on Count Number 1 is 6 and the Criminal History Classification (CHC) is I.

Probation

Defendant is sentenced to Supervised Probation for a period of 3 year(s) and shall be subject to the following conditions of Probation:

Defendant is subject to the following general conditions of probation (ORS 137.540):

- Start all required actions of probation, including payment of fines and fees, and complete any required evaluations and enrollment no later than 30 days after sentencing or release from custody, whichever is later. Defendant is responsible for paying all evaluation and treatment costs. Complete each action and submit written proof each action is complete as directed by the supervising probation officer. Unless otherwise ordered, complete all actions no later than half-way through the probation period.
- Pay supervision fees, fines, restitution or other fees ordered by the court.
- Not use or possess controlled substances except pursuant to a medical prescription.
- Submit to testing for controlled substance or alcohol use if the probationer has a history of substance abuse or if there is a reasonable suspicion that the probationer has illegally used controlled substances.
- Participate in a substance abuse evaluation as directed by the supervising officer and follow the recommendations of the evaluator if there are reasonable grounds to believe there is a history of substance abuse.
- Remain in the State of Oregon until written permission to leave is granted by the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency.
- If physically able, find and maintain gainful full-time employment, approved schooling, or a full-time combination of both. Any waiver of this requirement must be based on a finding by the court stating the reasons for the waiver.
- Change neither employment nor residence without prior permission from the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency.
- Permit the parole and probation officer to visit the probationer or the probationer's work site or residence and to conduct a walk-through of the common areas and of the rooms in the residence occupied by or under the control of the probationer.
- Consent to the search of person, vehicle or premises upon the request of a representative of the supervising officer if the supervising officer has reasonable grounds to believe that evidence of a violation will be found, and submit to fingerprinting or photographing, or both, when requested by the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency for supervision purposes.

- Not possess weapons, firearms or dangerous animals.
- Participate in a mental health evaluation as directed by the supervising officer and follow the recommendation of the evaluator.
- Report as required and abide by the direction of the supervising officer.
- Submit to a risk and needs assessment as directed by the supervising officer
- Keep the Court, supervising officers, and treatment providers advised of current physical and mailing address(es) and telephone number(s). Notify the Court in writing, listing each case you have, immediately upon any change in address or phone number.
- Comply with all Court orders.

- Complete 160 hours of Community Service Work (CSW). Report to Umatilla County Community Corrections County Parole and Probation Office to schedule and complete CSW Orientation within 30 days of sentencing or release from custody, whichever is later. Complete all community service work by July 4, 2017. CSW may be performed outside the county at the discretion and approval of the Umatilla County Community Corrections Parole and Probation Office. 10 sanction units used.
- Agree as a term of any transfer of probation to waive the in person appearance and agree to telephonic appearance of probation officer at any probation hearing.
- Sign necessary release of information form(s) including Health Information Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) materials to permit any screener, evaluator or treatment provider to release information to the referring screener/evaluator, the Court, District Attorney, and Community Corrections in order to monitor your compliance with ordered treatment of diagnosed issues.
- Have no employment providing health or other dependent care or any in-home services whether by private pay or payment directly or indirectly with Medicaid or Medicare funds, or acting as any person's Power of Attorney of representative in any capacity.
- Make no application for benefits for which Defendant is not entitled.
- Petition for misdemeanor treatment of this count, if desired, by filing a written request with the Court within one year of completing probation. The request should include the case number and proof that all terms of probation are complete.

Pursuant to the sentencing guidelines grid, the Defendant is subject to 180 sanction units with 90 jail units.

Jail as a Condition of Probation

Defendant is confined to jail for 20 day(s). Defendant is remanded to the custody of the Umatilla County Sheriff for transportation to the Supervisory Authority for service of this sentence. Defendant may receive credit for time served.

Sentencing Guidelines

The Crime Severity Classification (CSC) on Count Number 3 is 6 and the Criminal History Classification (CHC) is H.

Probation

Defendant is sentenced to Supervised Probation for a period of 3 year(s) and shall be subject to the following conditions of Probation:

Defendant is subject to the following general conditions of probation (ORS 137.540):

- Start all required actions of probation, including payment of fines and fees, and complete any required evaluations and enrollment no later than 30 days after sentencing or release from custody, whichever is later. Defendant is responsible for paying all evaluation and treatment costs. Complete each action and submit written proof each action is complete as directed by the supervising probation officer. Unless otherwise ordered, complete all actions no later than half-way through the probation period.
- Pay supervision fees, fines, restitution or other fees ordered by the court.
- Not use or possess controlled substances except pursuant to a medical prescription.

The Crime Severity Classification (CSC) on Count Number 4 is 3 and the Criminal History Classification (CHC) is G.

Probation

Defendant is sentenced to Supervised Probation for a period of 3 year(s) and shall be subject to the following conditions of Probation:

Defendant is subject to the following general conditions of probation (ORS 137.540):

- Start all required actions of probation, including payment of fines and fees, and complete any required evaluations and enrollment no later than 30 days after sentencing or release from custody, whichever is later. Defendant is responsible for paying all evaluation and treatment costs. Complete each action and submit written proof each action is complete as directed by the supervising probation officer. Unless otherwise ordered, complete all actions no later than half-way through the probation period.
- Pay supervision fees, fines, restitution or other fees ordered by the court.
