**JUDGMENT OF CONVICTION
AND SENTENCE**

This matter came before The Honorable Judge Charles Bailey on August 1, 2016 for sentencing. The State of Oregon appeared by Jodie A. Bureta, Special Deputy District Attorney, and the defendant appeared in person, with retained counsel Kevin Sali.

It appears to the Court that the defendant has been indicted, arraigned, has entered a not guilty plea, withdrawn that plea, and upon guilty plea(s), duly convicted of the crime(s) of Theft in the Second Degree (Class A misdemeanor) in Count 8, Making a False Claim for Health Care Payment (Class A misdemeanor) in Count 9 and Theft in the Second Degree (Class A misdemeanor) in Count 10.

It further appears to the Court that more than 48 hours have passed since plea entry, and there appears no good cause why sentence should not now be passed.

As to Counts 8,9 and 10, it is therefore CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Court suspends imposition of sentence, and places defendant on Court probation for a period of two (2) years, subject to all of the following special conditions of probation:

1. Defendant to be committed for ninety (90) days to Washington County Supervisory Authority on each Count to be imposed concurrently. Defendant may be considered for all alternative sanctions.
2. Obey all laws
3. Notify the Court in writing of any change of address within ten (10) days of move.
4. Obey all general conditions of probation (Pursuant to ORS 137.540).
5. Pay all Court-ordered restitution and any other court-ordered financial obligations.
6. Do not fraudulently obtain benefits from State or Federal Government.
7. If parents receive government benefits, defendant may not be involved in the benefits in any way.

The Court FINDS that the three offenses at issue arose out of a single scheme of criminal misconduct, and that the parties' stipulation to that effect is based on an accurate characterization of the facts underlying those offenses.

It is further ORDERED that defendant is sentenced to pay to the Clerk of the Court any financial obligations in the Money Award section which follows and in the manner specified (which section is hereby made a part of this judgment). The defendant's Security Deposit shall be applied to monies in this Judgment.

MONEY AWARD

The State of Oregon is the creditor and the defendant, Emile Irajpanah, is the debtor, jointly and severally for victim restitution purposes with co-defendant Mohsene Irajpanah), if ordered to pay.

1. \$300.00 Fine (\$100 in each Count).
