








Net Patient Revenue per Adjusted Discharge, compared to national trend




Net Patient Revenue per Adjusted Discharge, compared to national trend




Net Patient Revenue per Adjusted Discharge, compared to national trend

Hillsboro Medical Center's net patient revenue per adjusted discharge increased 51.1% since 2017, compared to a national median increase of 24.3%

Data Notes

Health system level data are collected from audited financial statements submitted to OHA. These reports are based on the fiscal year of the health system. Data includes the entire system and all affiliated organizations to that system, and in many cases include facilities located outside of Oregon. Health system data will note what states the health system operates in and the approximate size of the health system in terms of number of hospitals, clinics, and clinicians.

Hospital level data is collected from the Databank quarterly hospital financial reporting system. This data is all reported on a calendar year basis. Data are provided for the full year of 2021 and for the first three quarters (January 1st through September 30th) of 2022, which is the current year-to-date available.

Hospital level data also includes two metrics supplied by the National Academy for State Health Policy (NASHP) which are derived from Medicare Cost Reports. They are:

Net Patient Revenue per Adjusted Patient Discharge

Total Operating Costs per Adjusted Patient Discharge

These metrics use a calculated patient volume figure to establish an estimated "per discharge" amount for both the revenue a hospital earns providing health care services and the total amount of operating expenses it incurs. The NASHP provided metrics compare the individual hospital amounts with the nationwide median for all hospitals.
