ABOUT THIS REPORT

Hospitals play an important role in the health care system, as institutions that provide medical, surgical, and nursing care around the clock, and also as employers, research institutions, and centers to train the health care workforce. According to Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services reporting, hospital care accounts for over 30% of all health care spending every year. As Oregon continues its large scale health care transformation efforts, tracking costs and utilization of hospitals is an important part of monitoring the impact of these efforts.

This report monitors and compares financial and utilization information of Oregon's acute care inpatient hospitals. Data are presented quarterly for the previous nine quarters, and the report compares the most recent quarterly data with like quarters from previous years. For example, 4th quarter 2014 results will be compared to 4th quarter 2013 and 4th quarter 2012 results. As hospital trends are affected by seasonal variations, more attention should be placed on longer term trends rather than quarter to quarter variation.

The data source for this report is Databank. Databank is a database of self-reported financial and utilization information. Hospitals submit Databank data to the Oregon Health Authority on a quarterly basis. As Databank data are self-reported, they are not audited and this report is not intended as a substitute for audited financial statements.

Kaiser hospitals do not report financial data to Databank, but they do submit utilization data. They are included in utilization reports. Kaiser Westside opened for business in August of 2013, and Shriners' Children Hospital moved to DRG status in the beginning of 2013. These facilities may not have past year data available for comparison. There have not been any hospital closures in recent years.

Types of Hospitals

In this report, hospital data is presented by four categories: All hospitals, DRG hospitals, Type A hospitals and Type B hospitals.



There are 60 acute care inpatient hospitals in Oregon. These are general care facilities and exclude federal hospitals, long term care and rehabilitation facilities.



There are 28 DRG hospitals in Oregon. These are typically large, urban hospitals that receive payments based on the prospective Diagnostic Related Group (DRG) system.



There are 12 Type A hospitals in Oregon. These hospitals are small - fewer than 50 beds - and are located more than 30 miles from another hospital.



There are 20 Type B hospitals in Oregon. These hospitals are small - fewer than 50 beds - and are located within 30 miles of another hospital.


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HIGHLIGHTS FROM Q4 2014

How are health care reform efforts impacting hospitals? With large scale health care transformation underway in Oregon, data are becoming available on how these efforts and policies are changing the health care landscape. The information in this report provides early insight on the affects of health care transformation, including Affordable Care Act (ACA) implementation, on hospitals in Oregon. In January 2014, Oregon expanded eligibility for Medicaid to 138% of the federal poverty level. Since then, Medicaid enrollment increased by more than 400,000 people, and more than 80,000 people gained commercial coverage through the health insurance exchange. This report shows financial and utilization trends emerging in 2014 that are likely linked to this increase in health care coverage.


1 In 2014, Oregon hospitals were overall more profitable than in 2013. Operating margins increased, reflecting lower uncompensated care costs. Total margins also increased, reflecting improved investment returns and tax incomes.



2 Uncompensated care expenses fell across the state. As insurance coverage has increased, both charity care and bad debt costs have fallen by more than half in 2014, resulting in improved financial performance for hospitals.

Charity Care fell **-54%** to \$392 million in 2014

3 The number of self-pay, or uninsured charges fell 69% in 2014. This is likely a result of statewide increases in the number of Oregonians with insurance. This has also lead to declines in charity care and bad debt expenses.



4 The total number of emergency department visits increased in 2014, despite slowed growth in the 4th quarter of 2014. Newly insured people are using the emergency department at lower rates than existing insured people.

Emergency Room Visits increased **+7%** to 1.3 M total visits in 2014


NET PATIENT REVENUE

Net patient revenue grew at an average quarterly rate of 4.5% in 2014 for all hospitals in Oregon. All hospital types had a higher median net patient revenue in 2014 than in 2013. While Type B hospitals experienced a sharp drop in the 4th quarter of 2014, they still remained higher than the comparable 4th quarter of 2013.

Net patient revenue in 2014 was most likely affected by the sharp declines in uncompensated care. Because net patient revenue is the sum of gross revenue minus contractual amounts and uncompensated care, having greatly reduced uncompensated care increased net revenues across the board.

Net patient revenue had strong growth across all hospital types in 2014.

Median net patient revenue in millions




Net Patient Revenue is the amount a hospital expects to receive for services after accounting for contractual allowances to third party payers and for uncompensated care. This includes payments made for providing health care, such as surgeries, emergency services, lab tests, imaging, etc.

Net Patient Revenue is calculated by taking the total amount of money billed for patient care (gross patient revenue) and subtracting uncompensated care and contractual amounts.

Net patient revenue grew strongly in 2014.

Statewide average quarterly growth rate




OPERATING MARGIN

Statewide, the median operating margin was 4.1% in the 4th quarter of 2014, up from 1.2% in the 4th quarter of 2013. This reflects an average quarterly growth rate of 46.6% throughout 2014. For Type A and B hospitals, the median hospital continued to post negative operating margins. This is not unusual as the majority of smaller hospitals rely on tax subsidies to operate. The addition of those subsidies are reflected in the total margin.

Similar to net patient revenue, operating margins have improved largely due to significant drops in uncompensated care. Ultimately uncompensated care is an expense to the hospitals and reducing operating expense works to increase operating margins.

Median operating margins grew for DRG hospitals in 2014.

Median operating margin as a percent




Operating Margin is calculated as a ratio of operating revenue minus operating expenses divided by operating revenue. Operating revenue includes both net patient revenue, as well as revenue from other non-patient hospital services, such as cafeteria sales. Operating expenses are the expenses associated with running a hospital, such as supplies, salaries, rentals, professional fees, and insurance.

A positive operating margin means that the hospital is making a profit, while a negative margin means the hospital is operating at a loss.

Operating margins grew significantly in 2014.

Statewide average quarterly growth rate






TOTAL MARGIN

Statewide, the median total margin improved to 4.9% in the 4th quarter of 2014 compared to 4.1% in the 4th quarter of 2013. DRG and Type B hospitals in particular showed strong growth. DRG hospitals improved their 4th quarter total margins to 10.3% in 2014. The median Type B hospital reported overall profitability compared in 2014, growing total margins to 3.0%.

Total margins can improve beyond operating margins because of the inclusion of non-operating sources of revenue. Those sources are usually either investment income or tax subsidies. Those numbers fluctuate frequently as seen in the charts below. Smaller hospital types rely heavily on tax subsidies to operate. These taxes most often are collected at the county level as a part of property taxes. As property values increase and the overall economic status of the surrounding area improves, tax revenue increases for the hospital.

Median total margin grew more than 19% statewide in 2014.


Median total margin as a percent



Total Margin compares revenue and expenses from all sources, including investments, tax subsidies, and operations. It is calculated in the same manner as operating margin.

Total margin growth remained strong in 2014.

Statewide average quarterly growth rate







Financial Trends
PAYER MIX

All hospital types experienced drops in self-pay charges and increases in Medicaid charges in 2014. This was the expected outcome of the Affordable Care Act implementation on January 1, 2014. Expansion of Medicaid sharply reduced the number of uninsured individuals and increased the overall population of individuals on Medicaid. Self-pay charges fell 68.6% in 2014 when compared to 2013. Medicaid charges increased 44% when compared to 2013. Commercial charges decreased in 2014; however they started showing signs of growth in the 4th quarter. This is likely a sign that with a growing economy more employers are providing health insurance coverage to employees and that more people are adopting the health insurance exchanges to gain individual insurance plans.

Self-Pay charges decreased 69% and Medicaid charges increased 44% in 2014.


Percent of total patient payments



Payer mix shows the share of hospital revenue from different payer sources. It is calculated by dividing a payer's total charges by the total charges for all payers. A payer is an entity that assumes the majority of the financial responsibility for the hospital bill.

This report includes 4 broad payers: Medicare, Medicaid, commercial and self-pay. Since each payer reimburses hospitals at different rates, the payer mix can provide insight to the hospitals larger financial performance.

Self-pay charges dropped 68.6% in 2014.







CHARITY CARE

Statewide, median charity care spending has fallen steadily since the end of 2013. In dollars, hospitals in Oregon spent about \$450 million less on charity care in 2014 than they spent in 2013. This reduction in charity care spending is a result of expanded health insurance coverage under the Affordable Care Act, which was implemented on January 1, 2014. Since charity care is an expense for hospitals, this reduction contributed to stronger net patient revenue, operating margins, and total margins for most hospital types in 2014.

Median charity care expenses fell more than 60% statewide in 2014.

Percent of gross patient revenue




Charity Care includes services that are provided for free or at a reduced cost to eligible patients. Each hospital or health system determines its own criteria for providing charity care based on factors such as income, employment status, or alternative sources of funds.

The total dollar amount a hospital waives is based on full established charges may be expressed as a percent of its gross patient revenue for comparison purposes. Charity care is a component of uncompensated care expense.

Hospitals spent \$450 million less on charity care in 2014.

Total spending for all hospitals in millions





Financial Trends
BAD DEBT

The median bad debt expense has fallen more than 65% statewide in Oregon since 2013. DRG and Type B hospitals had the most significant drops in bad debt expenses, with the median DRG hospital falling 69.6% and the median Type B hospital falling 70.5%. In terms of total spending, Oregon hospitals had \$225 Million less in bad debt expense in 2014 than they had in 2013.

Similar to charity care, the reduction in bad debt expense is due to the expansion of health insurance as a result of the Affordable Care Act implementation on January 1, 2014. As more individuals gain health care coverage, more people are able to pay bills for hospital services.

Median bad debt expense fell more than 65% statewide in 2014.

Bad Debt occurs when patients do not pay all or part of their bill for services. It is an unpaid bill for care, based on a hospital's full established charges, for which a hospital expects payment but is unable to collect. Bad debt can include unpaid components of the total bill such as co-payments and co-insurance. Like charity care, bad debt is expressed as a percent of gross patient revenue.

Bad debt expense fell by \$225 million in 2014.

Total expense for all hospitals in millions




UNCOMPENSATED CARE

Uncompensated care is the sum of charity care and bad debt expenses, and reflects trends in those measures. Median uncompensated care as a percent of gross patient revenue fell over 63% in 2014. DRG and Type B hospitals had the greatest reductions in uncompensated care spending. In 2013, Oregon hospitals combined to spend over \$1.2 billion on uncompensated care, the equivalent of nearly 7% of total revenue. In 2014, that number fell by more than half to \$605.7 million. In 2014, the average individual hospital spent about \$10 million less on uncompensated care than in 2013.

The sharp reductions in uncompensated care are due to the expansion of health insurance under implementation of the Affordable Care Act on January 1, 2014. Because rates of uninsured hospitalizations have fallen, fewer patients are unable to pay their bills, reducing charity care and bad debt expenses.

Median uncompensated care fell more than 63% statewide in 2014.


Percent of gross patient revenue



Uncompensated Care is the total of charity care and bad debt expenses. It measures the total value of care, based on established charges, that a hospital provides without receiving payment. Because it is an expense, uncompensated care directly affects revenue and margin numbers.

Uncompensated care costs fell \$682 million in 2014.

Total expense for all hospitals in millions




INPATIENT DISCHARGES

Compared with 2013, inpatient discharges increased just over 1% in 2014. In general, inpatient discharges remain fairly consistent year to year because most people are only admitted to the hospital when completely necessary. Inpatient care is not as affected by non-emergent care like primary care physicians, urgent care and emergency rooms can be. As a part of a longer term trend, inpatient discharges have been slowly dropping for a number of years. It is unclear why discharges took an uptick in 2014, though it is possible it is related to the expansion of health insurance on January 1, 2014. The growth in discharges was driven mostly by DRG hospitals.

Inpatient discharges grew for DRG hospitals 2014.


Count of quarterly hospital discharges



Inpatient discharge occurs when a patient is formally released from the hospital after being admitted and lodged for at least 24 hours. This report represents Inpatient Discharge is a count of hospitalizations. It is not a count of unique individuals, however, as a single person can be admitted to the hospital multiple times a year.

Total inpatient discharges increased 1.1% in 2014.

Total discharges for all hospitals




EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT VISITS

The number of emergency department (ED) visits increased statewide by 7.2% in 2014. After a sizable increase in ED visits in early 2014, growth slowed in the 3rd quarter and dropped in the 4th quarter. The increase in ED visits may be due to multiple factors, such as increased health insurance coverage through Medicaid expansion and the exchange, as well as delays in accessing primary care. While the count of ED visits are up, recent reports show that the rate of ED visits for all insured people dropped in 2014. Individuals newly insured through Medicaid used emergency departments at lower rates than other Medicaid members. After rising steadily in 2014, the number of ED visits dropped in the 4th quarter.

Count of total quarterly emergency visits




Emergency Department Visits are reported as the number of visits to a hospital emergency department that do not result in a hospital admission. A person that visits the emergency department and is then admitted is counted as an inpatient discharge.

This report focuses on the count of ED visits, but cannot provide information about the rate of ED use - i.e. how frequently individuals in a given population visit the ED.

Total ED visits increased 7.2% in 2014.

Total emergency room visits in millions




OUTPATIENT SURGERIES

Hospital outpatient surgeries for all hospital types increased over 5% in 2014 when compared to 2013. Volumes of outpatient surgeries have been slowly dropping in Oregon hospitals for a number of years, mostly due to competition from free standing ambulatory surgical centers. Increases in outpatient surgeries are likely a combination of increased demand due to expanded health insurance and hospitals adapting to market conditions with what outpatient services they offer. A large number of outpatient surgeries are elective procedures, or non-emergency procedures such as cataracts surgery or various orthopedic procedures. Increases in volumes may also indicate improving economic conditions resulting in increased elective procedures.

Outpatient Surgeries increased for all hospital types in 2014.


Total count of quarterly outpatient surgeries



Outpatient Surgeries include surgeries performed at the hospital that do not require an inpatient stay. These discharges consist primarily of non-emergency, planned services in which the patient is treated and released in the same day. Outpatient surgery numbers do not include standard lab work, clinic visits or most diagnostic imaging work.

Outpatient surgeries increased by 5.4% in 2014.

APPENDIX

The following appendix pages contain individual hospital results for the measures included in this report. Data are provided annually for the past five years, from 2010 to 2014.

Kaiser hospitals are not included in financial measures, as Kaiser does not submit financial data for individual hospitals. Some information is not available for Kaiser Westside, as it recently opened, and for Shriners' Children's Hospital, as it recently became a DRG hospital.

As previously described, hospitals in Oregon are divided into 3 large categories of hospital based on size and distance to other hospitals. In addition to these categories, there are two other key designations a hospital might have that can impact its financial and utilization outcomes. Those are health district and critical access hospitals.

A **health district hospital** is a one that is under the control of a formal health district. In most cases the controlling entity is the local county government. Being a part of a health district allows the hospitals access to tax funding to contribute to operations. This access to tax funding allows many hospitals to continue to operate in the rural areas in which they exist in. Health districts may also provide funding to other types of clinics and providers as well.

A **critical access hospital** is designated by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). This designation impacts the reimbursement the hospital receives from Medicare. There are a number of specific criteria a hospital must meet to be considered a critical access hospital, but in general a hospital must be located in a rural area with limited access to other hospitals. In exchange for providing additional services that the hospital might not otherwise provide due to the cost, Medicare will reimburse the hospital at a higher rate than other hospitals receive for the same service. These services mostly relate to expanded emergency services such as a 24 hour emergency room and ambulance transportation.

In the following pages health district hospitals are indicated with an asterisk (*) and critical access hospitals are designated with a Greek letter (ϕ).
