## ABOUT THIS REPORT

Hospitals play an important role in the health care system, as institutions that provide medical, surgical, and nursing care around the clock, and also as employers, research institutions, and centers to train the health care workforce. According to Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services reporting, hospital care accounts for over 30% of all health care spending every year. As Oregon continues its large scale health care transformation efforts, tracking costs and utilization of hospitals is an important part of monitoring the impact of these efforts.

This report monitors and compares financial and utilization information for Oregon's acute care inpatient hospitals. Data are presented quarterly for the previous nine quarters, and the report compares the most recent quarterly data with like quarters from previous years. For example, quarter one 2015 results will be compared to quarter one 2014 and quarter one 2013 results. As hospital trends are affected by seasonal variations, more attention should be placed on longer term trends rather than quarter to quarter variation.

The data source for this report is Databank. Databank is a database of self-reported financial and utilization information. Hospitals submit Databank data to the Oregon Health Authority on a quarterly basis. As Databank data are self-reported, they are not audited and this report is not intended as a substitute for audited financial statements.

Kaiser hospitals do not report financial data to Databank, but they do submit utilization data. They are included in utilization reports. Kaiser Westside opened for business in August of 2013, and Shriners' Children Hospital moved to DRG status in the beginning of 2013. These facilities may not have past year data available for comparison. There have not been any hospital closures in recent years.

### Types of Hospitals

In this report, hospital data is presented by four categories: All hospitals, DRG hospitals, Type A hospitals and Type B hospitals.



There are 60 acute care inpatient hospitals in Oregon. These are general care facilities and exclude federal hospitals, long term care and rehabilitation facilities.



There are 28 DRG hospitals in Oregon. These are typically large, urban hospitals that receive payments based on the prospective Diagnostic Related Group (DRG) system.



There are 12 Type A hospitals in Oregon. These hospitals are small - fewer than 80 beds - and are located more than 30 miles from another hospital.



There 20 Type B hospitals in Oregon. These hospitals are small - fewer than 50 beds - and are located within 30 miles of another hospital.


# HIGHLIGHTS FROM Q1 2015

In 2015, we enter the second year of major health policy reforms enacted under the Affordable Care Act (ACA). The Oregon Health Authority is committed to tracking and reporting on the impacts key policy reforms, such as the creation of the health insurance exchange and expansion of Medicaid eligibility to people with incomes up to 138% of the poverty level. This report includes financial and utilization data through quarter one 2015.

Medicaid expansion has increased the number of individuals with health care coverage, shifting the payer mix for hospitals and reducing uncompensated care. Continuing trends from 2014, these changes have resulted in positive financial outcomes for Oregon's hospitals. Rural hospitals in Oregon still face ongoing financial hardships, but even the smallest hospitals in Oregon have improved their financial standing compared to several years ago.

**1** In the Q1 2015, statewide operating margins increased 154% compared to Q1 2014. Total margins improved across the state as well, increasing from 3.8% in the first quarter of 2014 to 5.3% in the first quarter of 2015.

increased 154%




**2** Uncompensated care expenses continue to fall across the state. Compared Q1 2014, uncompensated care expense fell by more than \$100 million statewide.

Charity Care fell **-41%** to \$69 million in 2015 Q1

**3** Oregon inpatient hospital discharges rose 4.4% when compared Q1 of 2014. Increases in utilization are likely related to the expansion of health insurance and the result of pent up demand for health care services.

**4** More people visited the emergency room in Q1 2015 than in Q1 2014. Rates of newly insured people using the emergency room remain lower than rates of use for people with pre-expansion insurance.


# NET PATIENT REVENUE

Net patient revenue continued to grow for all hospital types when compared to previous quarter one totals. DRG hospitals slowed the previous strong growth they experienced in the past year, but still ended quarter one 2015 higher than in 2014. Type B hospitals had the strongest growth, increasing their quarter one net patient revenue amounts by 13.2% from quarter one 2014. Type B hospitals also enjoyed a strong rebound from a poor quarter four.

Strong net patient revenue growth across the state is likely a product of reduced uncompensated care amounts and the expansion of health insurance that occurred on January 1st, 2014.

Median net patient revenue in millions




Net Patient Revenue is the amount a hospital expects to receive for services after accounting for contractual allowances to third party payers and for uncompensated care. This includes payments made for providing health care, such as surgeries, emergency services, lab tests, imaging, etc.

Net patient revenue is calculated by taking the total amount of money billed for patient care (gross patient revenue) and subtracting uncompensated care and contractual amounts.

Median percent increase from previous quarter




# OPERATING MARGIN

All hospital types had improved quarter one results compared to previous years. The median Type B hospital showed the strongest overall growth, increasing 191.7% from 2014 and ending quarter one 2015 in the positive for the first time in the past two years. DRG hospitals remain the strongest performing hospitals, with the median operating margin at 7.3%. Statewide, hospitals showed decreased operating margin compared to quarter four 2014, however that is likely due to the seasonal affects of hospitalizations, as long term trends reveal hospital discharges tend to decrease in the first quarter.

Improved operating margins are likely due to increased patient revenues and decreased uncompensated care expenses.

Median operating margin as a percent




**Operating Margin** is calculated as a ratio of operating revenue minus operating expenses divided by operating revenue. Operating revenue includes net patient revenue as well as revenue from other non-patient hospital services, such as cafeteria sales. Operating expenses are the expenses associated with running a hospital, such as supplies, salaries, rentals, professional fees, and insurance.

A positive operating margin means that the hospital is making a profit, while a negative margin means the hospital is operating at a loss.

Median percent increase from previous quarter




# TOTAL MARGIN

Compared to quarter one 2014, every hospital type more than doubled their median total margins. Statewide, hospitals reported greater total margins in quarter one 2015 than in each of the previous two first quarters. The median type B hospital had the strongest growth, up from -0.6% to 2.1% a growth of over 450%. Type A hospitals as a whole improved their financial position most significantly as only 1 of 12 hospitals reported a negative total margin, improving from 5 of 12 in 2014. Eight of twenty Type B hospitals reported a negative total margin. While this is an improvement from 12 of 20, it highlights the struggles some rural hospitals are still experiencing.

Improvements in total margins can be attributed to the reduction of uncompensated care expenses, as well as improvements in market conditions and real estate values.


## Median total margins increased for all hospital types in Q1 2015.

**Total Margin** compares revenue and expenses from all sources, including investments, tax subsidies, and operations. It is calculated by dividing all sources of income by all expenses.

## Quarter total margin growth continued in Q1







Financial Trends  
**PAYER MIX**

In 2014, as a result of Medicaid expansion, all hospital types saw self-pay payments decrease and Medicaid payments increase. This trend continued through quarter one 2015, though the change was smaller. During the same time period, the percent of Medicare payments increased. Population effects, such as more baby boomers reaching age 65, may be contributing to the increase in Medicare payments. Commercial payments decreased in quarter one 2015.

Because commercial payers generally reimburse at the highest rate, decreases in commercial payments can contribute to lower margins for hospitals.

**Medicare charges increased and commercial charges decreased in Q1 2015.**


*Percent of total patient payments*



**Payer mix** shows the share of hospital revenue from different payer sources. It is calculated by dividing a payer's total charges by the total charges for all payers. A payer is an entity that assumes the majority of the financial responsibility for the hospital bill.

This report includes 4 broad payers: Medicare, Medicaid, commercial and self-pay. Since each payer reimburses hospitals at different rates, the payer mix can provide insight to the hospitals larger financial performance.

**Self-pay percentage continued to shrink in Q1 2015.**







# CHARITY CARE

Median charity care amounts have fallen steadily since 2013. All hospital types spent just over 1% of their gross patient revenue on charity care. In 2013, charity care amounts were 3-4% of gross patient revenue. Statewide, in quarter one 2015, hospitals reported spending \$62.6 million less on charity care than they spent in quarter one 2014 and \$133.8 million less than they spent in quarter one 2013.

The reduction in charity care amounts can be attributed to Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act. As more Oregonians gain insurance, fewer people are in need of financial assistance from hospitals in the form of charity care.

*Percent of gross patient revenue*




**Charity Care** includes services that are provided for free or at a reduced cost to eligible patients. Each hospital or health system determines its own criteria for providing charity care based on factors such as income, employment status, or alternative sources of funds. The value of charity care is based on a hospital's full established charges and may be equal to the full charge or any portion of it the hospital elects to provide for free.

The total dollar amount a hospital waives may be expressed as a percent of its gross patient revenue for comparison purposes.

*Total charges for all hospitals in millions*





# BAD DEBT

Median bad debt amounts have continued to fall for the past two years. Statewide, the median quarter one bad debt expense fell over 57% from quarter one of 2014. In total, hospitals had \$40.8 million less in bad debt expense in quarter one of 2015 than last year. Quarter one bad debt expense is down just over \$70 million from two years ago.

The reductions in bad debt expense can be attributed to the expansion of health insurance as part of the provisions of the affordable care act. This has resulted in few uninsured patients, and has reduced the overall financial burden on many patients.

Between Q1 2014 and Q1 2015, median bad debt expense fell more than 57% statewide.


*Percent of gross patient revenue*



**Bad Debt** occurs when patients do not pay all or part of their bill for services. It is an unpaid bill for care, based on a hospital's full established charges, for which a hospital expects payment but is unable to collect. Bad debt can include unpaid components of the total bill such as co-payments and co-insurance. Like charity care, bad debt is expressed as a percent of gross patient revenue.

Quarter one bad debt fell \$40.8 million in 2015.

*Total expense for all hospitals in millions*




# UNCOMPENSATED CARE

Uncompensated care includes both charity care and bad debt expenses, and reflects trends in those measures. Uncompensated care continued its downward trend in quarter one 2015, down more than \$100 million from quarter one 2014. Uncompensated care is a large expense for hospitals that directly affects margin performance. Decreases in uncompensated care can result in higher operating margins and total margins, and overall stronger financial performance.

## Uncompensated care continued its downward trend in Q1 2015.


Percent of gross patient revenue



**Uncompensated Care** is the total of charity care and bad debt expenses. It measures the total value of care, based on established charges, that a hospital provides without receiving payment. Because it is an expense, uncompensated care directly affects revenue and margin numbers.

Total expense for all hospitals in millions




# INPATIENT DISCHARGES

In Q1 2015, the number of inpatient discharges increased statewide compared to quarter one of both 2014 and 2013. DRG hospitals reported the largest increase, growing 4.4%, or 3,000 stays, from quarter one 2014 to quarter one 2015. Due to the high cost of inpatient stays, elective procedures are limited and patients are generally only admitted for medically necessary care. Because of this, the Medicaid expansion is likely to have lesser impact on trends in inpatient discharges. Population increases, especially in the Portland metro area, and the aging baby boomer population are likely to be the more significant factors that influence inpatient discharges. According to the US Census Bureau, the Portland Metro area alone grew by 33,500 people between 2013 and 2014. Additionally, according to the Portland State Population Research Center, Oregon increased its 65 and older population by 28,000 people between 2013 and 2014. Count of quarterly hospital discharges




**Inpatient discharge** occurs when a patient is formally released from the hospital after being admitted and lodged for at least 24 hours. This report represents Inpatient Discharge is a count of hospitalizations. It is not a count of unique individuals, however, as a single person can be admitted to the hospital multiple times a year.

Inpatient discharges are acute care only and do not count rehabilitation, long term care or specialized psychiatric care.

Total discharges for all hospitals




# EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT VISITS

Emergency department (ED) visits have increased for all hospital types in quarter one 2015. DRG and Type B hospitals had the largest increases, compared with counts in quarter one 2014 and 2013. This increase in volume is likely driven by more Oregonians getting health insurance coverage through the Affordable Care Act and a larger population, as previously noted. This report presents counts of data, other OHA reports have looked at the rate of ED use for people enrolled in Medicaid, and have shown that newly insured individuals use the ED at lower rates than individuals who were previously insured. Count of total quarterly emergency visits




**Emergency Department Visits** are reported as the number of visits to a hospital emergency department that do not result in a hospital admission. A person that visits the emergency department and is then admitted is counted as an inpatient discharge.

This report focuses on the count of ED visits, but cannot provide information about the rate of ED use - i.e. how frequently individuals in a given population visit the ED.

Total emergency room visits






# OUTPATIENT SURGERIES

Statewide outpatient surgeries fell in quarter one 2015. This was driven by DRG and Type B hospitals facing lower volumes than previous first quarter periods. This likely reflects increased competition from free standing ambulatory surgical centers (ASCs) for outpatient surgery services. Type A hospitals were likely insulated from this effect based on their more isolated and rural locations in the state. Free standing ASCs are generally located in areas with larger populations.

Reduced volumes of outpatient surgeries can reflect lost business and impact hospital performance, but not always. Many hospitals and health systems own free standing ambulatory surgical centers as separate business entities.

## Type A hospitals experienced an increase in outpatient surgeries in Q1 2015.


Total count of quarterly outpatient surgeries



**Outpatient Surgeries** include surgeries performed at the hospital that do not require an overnight stay. These discharges consist primarily of non-emergency, planned services in which the patient is treated and released in the same day. Outpatient surgery numbers do not include standard lab work, clinic visits or most diagnostic imaging work.

## APPENDIX

The following appendix pages contain individual hospital results for the measures included in this report. Data are provided as first quarter results for the past five years, from 2011 to 2015.

Kaiser hospitals are not included in financial measures, as Kaiser does not submit financial data for individual hospitals. Some information is not available for Kaiser Westside, as it recently opened, and for Shriners' Children's Hospital, as it recently became a DRG hospital.

As previously described, hospitals in Oregon are divided into three categories based on size and distance to other hospitals. In addition to these categories, there are two other key designations a hospital might have that can impact its financial and utilization outcomes. Those are health district and critical access hospitals.

A **health district hospital** is a one that is under the control of a formal health district. In most cases the controlling entity is the local county government. Being a part of a health district allows the hospitals access to additional funds from tax sources to contribute to operations. This access to tax funding allows many hospitals to continue to operate in rural areas when they otherwise could not afford to. Health districts may also provide funding to other types of clinics and providers.

A **critical access hospital** is designated by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). This designation impacts the reimbursement the hospital receives from Medicare. There are a number of specific criteria a hospital must meet to be considered a critical access hospital, but in general a hospital must be located in a rural area with limited access to other hospitals. In exchange for providing additional services that the hospital might not otherwise provide due to the cost, Medicare will reimburse the hospital at a higher rate than other hospitals receive for the same service. These services mostly relate to expanded emergency services such as a 24 hour emergency room and ambulance transportation.

In the following pages health district hospitals are indicated with an asterisk (\*) and critical access hospitals are designated with a Greek letter ( $\phi$ ).
