#### Financial Trends Q1 2025

This brief summarizes the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter (Q1) 2025 update of the <u>Oregon Hospital Financial and Utilization Dashboard</u>, OHA's interactive display of statewide hospital financial and utilization data. For definitions of the measures in this report, see the <u>glossary of key terms</u> or visit the <u>Hospital Reporting Program website</u>. Data are self-reported and subject to change. Shriners Children's Portland is excluded because it is a charity hospital and does not directly bill patients.

#### Year-over-year trends (Q1 2024 to Q1 2025)

- Total operating revenue **increased** 5.4 percent, from \$4.84 billion to \$5.11 billion.
- Net patient revenue increased 6.8 percent, from \$4.48 billion to \$4.78 billion.
- Total operating expense **increased** 12.3 percent, from \$4.80 billion to \$5.40 billion.
- Operating margin decreased from \$40.3 million to -\$288.9 million.

#### Oregon hospitals report slight decrease in statewide total operating revenue and net patient revenue between Q4 2024 and Q1 2025


In Q1 2025, statewide **total operating revenue**, the amount hospitals received for providing patient care and other hospital services, was \$5.11 billion. It decreased \$30.8 million (0.6 percent) from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and increased \$261.9 million (5.4 percent) from Q1 2024, one year prior.

In Q1 2025, 93.6 percent of **total operating revenue** came from **net patient revenue**, the amount hospitals received for providing care to patients. Statewide **net patient revenue** was \$4.78 billion. It decreased \$598,113 (0.01 percent) from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and increased \$302.8 million (6.8 percent) from Q1 2024, one year prior.

**Total operating revenue** and **net patient revenue** decreased in Q1 2025, after a year of growth in 2024


**Net patient revenue** made up nearly 94 percent of **total operating revenue** in Q1 2025


### Statewide total operating expense outpaced total operating revenue in Q1 2025, following a year of revenue growth in 2024


In Q1 2025, statewide **total operating expense**, the amount spent to operate hospitals, was \$5.40 billion. It increased \$256.4 million (5.0 percent) from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and increased \$591.0 million (12.3 percent) from Q1 2024, one year prior. In Q1 2025, statewide total operating expense exceeded total operating revenue by \$288.9 million.

In Q1 2025, **payroll expense**, the amount hospitals spent to compensate employees, was \$2.16 billion (40.0 percent of statewide total operating expense). It increased \$161.2 million (8.1 percent) from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and increased \$123.8 million (14.1 percent) from Q1 2024, one year prior.

**Total operating expense** exceeded **total operating revenue** by nearly \$300 million in Q1 2025

**Payroll expense** made up nearly 40 percent of **total operating expense** between Q1 2023 and Q1 2025





# Type A hospitals reported the greatest increase in average monthly payroll, DRG hospitals reported the greatest decrease

In Q1 2025, **statewide monthly payroll per full-time employee** (FTE), the average amount a full-time hospital employee earned per month, was \$8,582. It decreased \$972 (10.1 percent) from the previous quarter, Q4 2024 and decreased \$820 (8.7 percent) from Q1 2024, one year prior.

In Q1 2025, monthly payroll per FTE was \$9,843 at Type A hospitals. It increased \$1,145 (13.2 percent) from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and increased \$1,165 (13.4 percent) from Q1 2024, one year prior.

In Q1 2025, **monthly payroll per FTE** was \$9,621 at **Type B hospitals**. It decreased \$2 (0.02 percent) from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and increased \$384 (4.2 percent) from Q1 2024, one year prior.

In Q1 2025, monthly payroll per FTE was \$8,391 at **DRG hospitals**. It decreased \$1,214 (12.6 percent) from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and decreased \$1,087 (11.5 percent) from Q1 2024, one year prior.

**Type A hospitals** reported the greatest quarter-overquarter increase in average monthly pay in Q1 2025





## Increased expenses and reduced revenue lead to decreased total margin and operating margin between Q4 2024 and Q1 2025

Expenses exceeded revenue in Q1 2025, leading to negative **total margin** and **operating margin** 



In Q1 2025, **operating margin**, the remaining profit hospitals keep after subtracting total operating expense from total operating revenue, was -\$288.9 million. It decreased \$287.1 million from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and decreased \$329.2 million from Q4 2024, one year prior. **Operating margin** is an indicator of financial health; a positive operating margin value indicates that hospitals earned enough operating revenue to cover operating expenses.

In Q1 2025, **total margin**, the remaining profit hospitals keep after subtracting total expense from total revenue, was -\$234.3 million. It decreased \$200.7 million from the previous quarter, Q4 2024, and decreased \$518.3 million from Q1 2024, one year prior. Total revenue includes all income sources, such as profit, investments, and tax subsidies. **Total margin** is an indicator of overall financial standing; a positive total margin value indicates that hospitals earned enough total revenue to cover total expenses.

## Negative margins at DRG hospitals lead to negative statewide margins, while margins were positive at Type A and B hospitals

In Q1 2025, total margin as a percent of total revenue, or profit margin, was -5.7 percent statewide, 0.1 percent at Type A hospitals, 1.1 percent at Type B hospitals, and -6.9 percent at DRG hospitals. In Q1 2025, operating margin as a percent of total operating revenue, or operating profit margin, was -4.5 percent statewide, 4.5 percent at Type A hospitals, 2.2 percent at Type B hospitals, and -6.0 percent at DRG hospitals. A positive profit margin or operating profit margin indicates that for each dollar earned in revenue, a hospital spent less than a dollar on expenses. A negative value indicates that for each dollar earned in revenue, a hospital spent more than a dollar on expenses.
