 - Value-based Benefits Subcommittee (broad range of clinical recommendations related to Oregon Health Plan coverage; meets 8 a.m.-1 p.m. usually on second or third Thursdays of January, March, May, August, October and November)
 - Evidence-based Guidelines Subcommittee (in-depth reviews of challenging topics, recommendations for all health plans; meets 2-5 p.m., usually on first Thursday of February, April, June, September and December)
- Principal occupation or advocacy role (if any)
- Professional license type (enter NA if you are not a licensed healthcare provider)
- Other relevant memberships/affiliations (for example, board memberships, professional or service organizations)
- Please briefly explain why you are interested in serving on HERC or a subcommittee, and why you would be a good candidate for membership.
