

OHA seeks public input about Kindred Hospice/Gentiva

Have you or a loved one received care at Kindred Hospice or Gentiva in the past year? We want to hear from you!

The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) reviews health care business deals, like mergers and acquisitions, to make sure they won't harm people and communities in Oregon.

Last year, a private equity firm became an owner of Kindred Hospice, now known as Gentiva, a hospice company with locations in Lake Oswego and Salem. OHA wants to understand how this ownership change has affected hospice patients and their families. We want to know:

- How was the quality of the care you received from Gentiva/Kindred Hospice?
- Did you notice any changes during the time you or your loved one received care?
- Were you satisfied with how often Gentiva staff visited you or your loved one?
- How easy or difficult was it to contact staff when you needed help?
- Did you have to pay out-of-pocket for services not covered by your insurance?
