## **Concentra and Onsite**

The <u>Health Care Market Oversight</u> (HCMO) program reviews heath care business deals to make sure they support Oregon's goals of health equity, lower costs, increased access, and better care. On May 13, 2025, the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) accepted a complete notice of material change transaction describing plans for Concentra Health Services, Inc. ("Concentra") to acquire Onsite Innovations, LLC ("Onsite").

#### Who's involved?

**Concentra** is a for-profit, publicly traded company headquartered in Texas that facilitates the delivery of occupational health services to the employees of their customers. Concentra operates four primary businesses: occupational health centers, onsite health clinics, telemedicine, and other services such as pharmacy repackaging operations. Concentra directly provides or contracts with medical professionals to provide physical exams, immunizations, drug and alcohol screening, advanced primary care, and urgent care. Concentra has four occupational health centers in Oregon, all in the Portland metropolitan area.

**Onsite** is a fully owned indirect subsidiary of Athletico, a privately held corporation specializing in occupational therapy and athletic training. Onsite provides worksite occupational health clinics and provides injury and illness care, job-related physical exams, regulatory testing, health and wellness programs, and ergonomics programs. These services are provided to the employees of the employers who contract with Onsite. Onsite employs or contracts with seven clinicians who provide services in Oregon.

#### About the deal

Concentra plans to acquire 100% of the membership interest of Onsite. Through this transaction, Onsite will become wholly owned by Concentra. Concentra states that this transaction will enable continued growth of employer-based health care service models in Oregon. Concentra expects to maintain and improve the existing Onsite scope of services.

### What's next?

OHA is reviewing this deal to understand how it could affect access to care for communities in Oregon. During the review, OHA will use health care data, news and media reports, information from the entities, and public input to decide whether the deal should be approved. After completing a review, OHA will issue a decision about whether the deal may proceed as planned. We want to hear from you!
